Born on 25 July 1921 in Darley Dale to parents Lillian and Stan, Dorothy was educated at Churchtown School. On leaving school she worked as a clippie on the Bakewell run of the Silver Service buses during the war. She met her husband, Allan, at a dance and they were married in St. Helen's Church, Darley Dale on 6 April, 1942. They moved to Bonsall in 1947 after Allan returned from the war and Dorothy lived on High Street for the next 66 years. She and Allan both loved ballroom dancing and went every week - Dorothy continuing to dance until she was 87. She was very particular about the appearance of her home, with fresh flowers in the windows and always carrying a duster in her apron pocket to flick away any specks of dust. She was also very particular about her appearance, with her hair done, make-up on and all her clothes matching. She enjoyed TV sports and quiz programmes; in fact anything that taxed her brain. When she was 91, Dorothy decided she would like to live at Valley Lodge Nursing Home and she spent the last year of her life there. She passed away on April 26, 2014. Her daughter Jenny adds: "Having spent most of her life on High Street, it was only fitting that she made her last journey from the home she loved. VILLAGE NOTICEBOARD

When we were young

Congratulations to everyone who was born in the 1930's, 40's, 50's, and 60's. First, we survived being born to mothers who smoked and/ or drank sherry while they carried us. While pregnant, they took aspirin, ate blue cheese, bread and dripping, raw egg products and loads of bacon and processed meat. Then after our birth, our baby cots were covered with bright coloured lead-based paints. Our parents didn't invent stupid names for their kids like 'Kiora' and 'Blade' and 'Ridge' and 'Vanilla'. As children, we had no childproof lids on medicine bottles and when we rode our bikes we had no helmets. We rode in cars with no seat belts or air bags ... not to mention the risks we took hitchhiking.

We drank water from the garden hose, not from a bottle. Take-away food was fish and chips - no pizza shops, Mac Donalds, KFC, Subway or Nandos. Even though all the shops closed at 5.00 pm and didn't open on a Sunday, somehow we didn't starve! You could only buy Easter eggs and hot cross buns at Easter time. We could collect old drinks bottles and cash them in at the corner shop to buy toffees, gobstoppers and bubblegum ... and we never ate a whole Mars bar. We ate cupcakes, white bread and real butter, milk from the cow, and drank soft drinks with sugar in them, but we weren't overweight because we were always playing outside! We rode bikes or walked to a friend's house, or just yelled for them! We would leave home in the morning and play all day, as long as we were back when the streetlights came on. No one was able to reach us and we were OK. We spent hours building go-carts out of old prams and riding them down the hill without brakes. We built tree-houses and dens and played in the streams. We did not have Playstations, Nintendo Wii, X-boxes, or video games; not 999 channels on SKY; no video/DVD films or colour TV; no mobile phones; no personal computers; no internet or chat rooms.... instead we had friends and went outside and found them! And only girls had pierced ears! We were given air guns and catapults for our 10th birthdays. We fell out of trees, got cut, broke bones and teeth without any lawsuits from these accidents. We ate worms and mud pies, and the worms did not live in us forever. Our parents told us to ask a stranger to

help us cross the road. Not everyone made the rugby/football/cricket/netball team and those who didn't had to learn to deal with disappointment. We had the freedom to fail or succeed, and responsibility, and we learned how to deal with it all. Our teachers hit us with canes and gym shoes and threw the blackboard rubber at us if they thought we weren't concentrating. We can string sentences together and spell and have proper conversations because of a solid three R's education. The idea of a parent bailing us out if we broke the law was unheard of. They sided with the law.

You might want to share this with others who had the luck to grow up before the lawyers and the Government regulated our lives for our own good. So forward it to your kids so they will know how brave their parents were.



Report from Bonsall Parish Council

The Annual Parish Meeting was held on 20 May at Bonsall Village Hall and is an opportunity for any parishioner to attend and raise issues they wish the Parish Council to consider.

Residents from Grangemill and lble attended the meeting to raise awareness of the proposed erection of 5 Wind Turbines at Manystones Lane, Brassington. The residents have concerns that the proposal will overdevelop the area in terms of wind turbines and the proposal will effectively fill the skyline in Grangemill with turbines and cause shadow flickering in all the houses in the Hamlet as all houses face towards the ridge the turbines will be placed on.

Bonsall Parish Council are being consulted on this Planning Application and Councillors wanted to make sure residents of Bonsall are aware of the application and have the opportunity to make their views heard at the Planning Committee meeting. Information and the application can be found by visiting https://planning.derbyshiredales.gov. uk/online-applications. You have to click on the search button and then select 'simple search' and type 'Manystones Lane' into the search box. Cllr Lane gave her report thanking her fellow Councillors and the Clerk for their work over the past 12 months working to provide some direct services for residents and local groups and brightening the village with the flowers and the Christmas lights. Cllr Lane paid tribute to the recently retired Finance Officer, Derek Robertson, and

welcomed the new Finance Officer, Tony Payne, noting the seamless transition. Cllr Lane thanked Leigh Johnson for his work as Village Handyman and general problem solver, Mick Biggin who continues to maintain the beautiful, eco friendly Churchyard and Peter Spencer who ensures we have, in Cllr Lane's opinion, the best kept footpaths in the county. Our District and County Councillors, Bob Cartwright, Garry Purdy and Irene Ratcliffe who attend our meetings, providing updates on matters affecting the village and deal with issues affecting the village promptly and efficiently – we note the prompt arrival of the sandbags! Cllr Lane thanked them on behalf of Bonsall Parish Council for their help and support over the year.

The Parish Council has now taken on responsibility for the toilets in Bonsall on a lease basis so they will remain open for residents and visitors throughout the year.

Finally as usual there are vacancies on the Parish Council and we would be delighted to welcome anyone who would be willing to give a couple of hours a month to extend the work of the Parish Council on behalf of the village. If you are interested please contact the Clerk or any Councillor for more information.

The Annual Parish Meeting was followed by the Annual General Meeting of the Parish Council where Cllr Lane and Cllr Pountain were re-elected as Chair and Vice Chair respectively.






