

LETTERS

I would like to update everyone on the proposed building development in Uppertown and attempt to draw a line under the situation. I don't normally use Mutterings to share my opinions and will not be replying to any further letters, although I am more than willing to discuss the matter in person directly with anyone.

The planning application has been quashed after I successfully applied for a Judicial Review as I believed the Council had acted unlawfully in approving the planning permission. I had tremendous support, advice and encouragement from a lot of people within the village and beyond, people who have a genuine concern for the preservation and conservation of our great village.

To clarify the situation, everyone that I have spoken to that has supported our cause has no problem with affordable housing in the village, in the right location, with the right design and for village people.

It has been suggested that it would be useful to form a 'Bonsall affordable housing committee' asking for support from DDDC, where the committee could be proactive in suggesting plans and sites to DDDC, ensuring that people with local connections are given priority, rather than having unsuitable proposals thrust upon us. Although I would not want to be directly involved myself, I would give it my full support along with commitment from other villagers who have already expressed an interest.

It is interesting to note that, only since the application has been quashed, people in authority have been heard to suggest that Bonsall people would have found it difficult to be considered for the proposed development due to the scoring system currently being used pity they didn't admit this fact earlier. When it comes to 'wasting ratepayers money' the responsibility for wasting time and money lies directly with Derbyshire Dales District Council. No argument - this has been proven in law. They have tried to ride roughshod over local people without taking anyone's opinions seriously and even ignoring the recommendations by committees within their own organisation. DDDC needs to look long and hard at its own structures and systems. They need to consult with local people and realise that we all have a voice that needs to be listened to and taken into consideration. This is democracy in action.

It would be great if we, as a village community, could be in charge of our own destiny in helping to provide accommodation for local people with the support of our District Council and government. People who have voiced different and sometimes conflicting opinions could become directly involved and channel their combined energy and efforts in attempting to provide affordable housing in our village.

Mobile Library

Bonsall has been blessed an excellent mobile library service for many years. However, due to the cuts which Derbyshire County Council has to make, there was a consultation last year that resulted in many villages in Derbyshire losing their service and library workers losing jobs they enjoyed. Bonsall has been very lucky in retaining our service although in a reduced capacity. It used to visit every two weeks and stop in six places in the village including Uppertown. It will now be visiting monthly on a Friday stopping only once, though for a longer time, at The Fountain - dates beginning 16 January, 13 February, 13 March from 10.55 - 11.30 am. The bus is usually staffed by friendly workers and in my experience using the mobile library has been a very satisfying and personal service. Librarians go to great lengths to provide books that are ordered. They will phone to let you know if for some

PARISH COUNCIL

Councillors received an update on the situation with regard to the Byway Open to All Traffic (BOAT) order on Moor Lane. Once the routes have been added to the definitive map and granted BOAT status, a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) can be made. This is the only way to ban traffic on the route. DCC will take on board objections to the BOAT but they say dealing with those is likely to delay the process and may result in the matter being referred to appeal. In an appeal it is possible that the BOAT would be rejected and then a TRO could not be issued for the road. Councillors resolved that once the issue of the BOAT and TRO is dealt with they will then look at making appropriate representations to ensure that footpaths and bridle paths in the area are open for use. The Footpaths Officer from DCC will be invited to a future meeting to discuss the issue. Please talk to one of your Councillors or the Clerk if you want any further information on the process.

The Planning Application for affordable housing at Chestnut Farm has been withdrawn. It may be re-submitted pending additional research into the impact on the conservation area and the

Parish Council will circulate information should this be the case. Councillor Barry and Pete Spencer have been working hard to clear the Park Bottom of rubbish and Councillors agreed to request an additional rubbish bin from DDDC. Ideas for improving the Park Bottom will be welcomed at the Annual Parish Meeting later in the year. Pete Spencer has been working hard over the Christmas period to make sure fallen trees were cleared and Councillors thanked him for his efforts. Councillors asked all residents to note that there has been a change in arrangements for dog waste bins. Dog waste (in bags) can now be put in the regular waste bins in the village. Councillor Barry has canvassed residents in Uppertown about the street light near Bonsall Camp which was turned off as part of the street light review that DCC undertook in 2012. Residents wish to have the light re-instated and Council agreed to pursue this.

Budget: it was proposed and agreed unanimously that budget V3 for 2015/16 as tabled was approved with the following amendments which were intended to secure balances at the end of the 2015/16 of approximately £4500:

New Pay Scales: it was noted DALC had advised that the NJC pay increase of 2.2% applicable to the Clerk and RFO should also be applied to manual staff with effect from 1 January 2015; those staff would also be entitled to the NJC non-consolidated payments. 


