Ballooning Over Bonsall

Towards the end of April at 7.30 in the morning we were excited to hear and see a large red hot air balloon flying quite low over the back of Yeoman Street. It slowly drifted and climbed away from the village towards Masson Hill. The people on board would have had a fantastic aerial view of the centre of the village.

We nearly had the same view in March when we flew quite close to Bonsall in

a hot air balloon. For my 70th birthday last year, my son had bought us a balloon flight from Tissington. We had to wait nearly twelve months for the weather conditions to be right for flying, but the wait was well worthwhile. With a light south westerly wind we slowly rose above Tissington heading towards Parwich. It was interesting to see the old field patterns from the air and to pick out the various places we knew from walking the area. What we hadn't appreciated was how much difference there was in wind speed and direction at the different heights, which gave the pilot a certain amount of control. At one

time we were heading towards the wind turbines at Carsington but then turned towards Longcliffe. We then realised we may end up passing over Bonsall which would have been the icing on the cake.

Our track actually took us slightly west, passing over Bonsall Moor with good views of Bottom Leys Farm, Brumlea Farm, the allotments, Brightgate and back towards the village. We finally landed after just over an hour in the air in a field opposite Blakelow Farm on The Moor. We could have walked home but unfortunately we had to fetch the car from Tissington. It had been a fantastic experience being suspended in the air, slowly drifting with the silence broken only by the gas burners, which are memories that will stay with us for a long time. We were very lucky.

Anybody who has driven, walked or flown past Park Bottom over the past three weeks cannot have failed to notice on a Sunday morning the Bonsall Red Barrows preparing for the 2015 season. The Red Arrows have three months in Cyprus as their season warm up...we get the park, normally in the rain. So what does this year have in store for us and the great unsuspecting public? As I write this article in a very wet office, we have just completed our first sortie in Ashbourne to over a thousand spectators in almost ideal barrowing conditions. This weekend will see us for two days at the Bearded Music event at Catton Park where over 9000 festival goers will attend... some of the team will be there for the full four days, drinking in all the cultural atmosphere, and other things that will be on offer. This is when the whole base is shut down and the RAF says a massive thank you to the service families for supporting them over the past year. So those lucky people will get to see the world famous Bonsall Red Barrows perform as well as a few red planes doing things in the air. Last time the RAF could not have been kinder to us and pulled out all the stops to make sure we had a good day - and as you will see from our website, have pictures taken with the pilots and their planes. I did however have a few puzzled

looks from the staff in the control room where I did my commentary from... trying to explain to elite aerobatic pilots from the USA that we are there because we push wheelbarrows to rock music was an interesting experience. We have a new routine, new music, some new pilots and also nice to see aircraftsman Ginger Mac back with us again, after seeing him go over the jumps at Ashbourne it was like he had never been away. So we welcome to our ranks Mia, Sarah Jane and Robin who all passed the selection process with flying colours - i.e. a sense of humour and knowing left from right...most of the time. Will keep you informed as to how things go, and where Oxford is.

- Story-making and story-telling;
- Poetry-making and reading;
- Play-reading;
- Candle-making;
- Craft activities: banners, art for the Church;

- A Friends' of St James' / Bonsall village band/orchestra and/or community choir.

- * A Spring, Autumn or Christmas Fair
- * Local history exhibition – possibly to link with Wells/Carnival week?

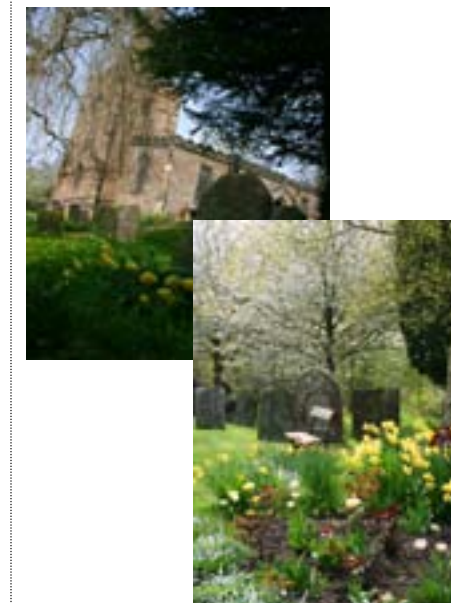
Possible fundraising aims:

Defibrillator Update

We still get asked what a defibrillator is and why this is so important for Bonsall: defibrillators are used to shock the heart back into rhythm after a heart attack, in the critical first minutes before an ambulance can respond. Every minute without defibrillation and CPR reduces the chance of survival by 10%. Thanks to generous donations and fundraising, our community now has a top-class fully automatic defibrillator and our first eight volunteers have been trained. A big thanks to them for volunteering. Report on the Annual Parish Meeting and the AGM of Bonsall Parish Council.

The Annual Parish Meeting was held at the Village Hall at 7 pm on Tuesday 19 May. In addition to the annual accounts of the Parish Council being presented, matters raised included possible improvements to the Park and it was suggested that the Parish Council set up a working party inviting members of the public, the Church PCC, the School and the WW1 commemoration group to join and develop a plan. 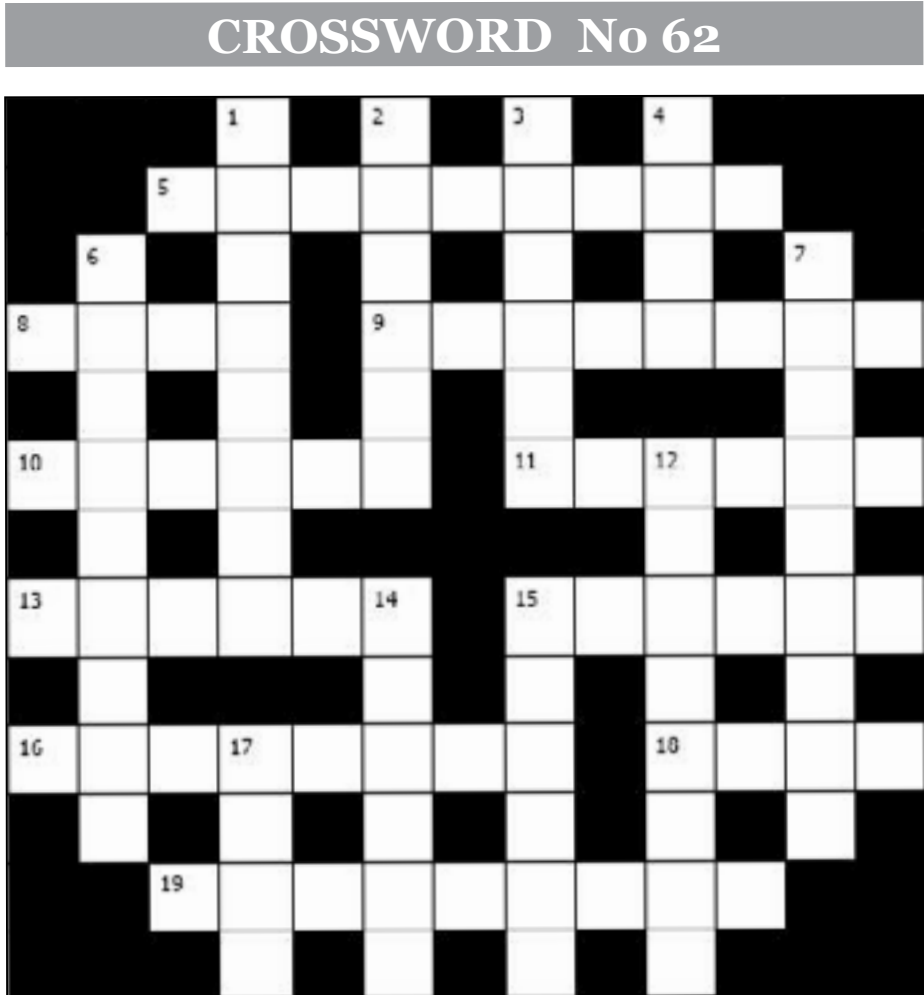
