CHURCH NEWS

We have very mixed feelings about REMEMBERING. Funerals focus around precious memories, keeping the person somehow 'alive' for us. Every person has things they would like to forget. There is the loaded statement "I can forgive but I will never forget". And I have heard this spoken by individuals who have been hurt or just taken offence. I have heard this uttered by communities even nations. Memory is different to History. History is someone else's story. It is about events that occurred in the past, to other people. Memory is MY story. It is about where I come from and of what narrative I am a part. History answers the question, "What happened ?" Memory answers the question "Who am I ?" Memory is about identity and belonging and the connection between the generations. In today's fast world we undervalue acts of remembering. Computer memories have grown, while ours have become ever shorter. Our sense of space has expanded. Our sense of time has shrunk. One of the greatest gifts we can give to our children is the knowledge of where

we have come from, the things for which we fought and why. None of the things we value - freedom, human dignity, justice - was achieved without a struggle. A society without a memory is like a journey without a map. It's all too easy to get lost. Here in this village community we have two events annually when we 'actively' remember. Along with the rest of the nation we observe Remembrance Day. And earlier in November (on or around) All Souls day we invite those who have lost loved ones, those who have been recently bereaved, to a memorial service with candles to light 'in memory'. Of course anyone who has lost loved ones beyond the boundaries of this village is also more than welcome, or indeed those who come every year 'to remember'. Here at Bonsall we have a third occasion as we put up the 'memory tree' in the lead up to Christmas. If you know of a neighbour who has lost a loved one - do extend an invitation, or even better bring them along in support. With love and blessings.



100 YEARS AGO

Mischief, vagrancy and pluckiness

The long school holidays, and absence of the steadying hand of so many menfolk, resulted in young people getting into mischief. Councillor George Boam, of Low Farm, complained to the Children's Court that a milk can he used for watering was damaged by the stone throwing of Samuel Gilbert, Stanley Gratton, Frank Land, and Sidney Taylor. They were each fined 5/6 (27.5p) and 4d (2p) costs. Additionally they were charged with damaging telephone wire insulators by stone throwing. Sidney Taylor claimed he told the others to stop. Each was fined £1.

In the Police Court William Locksley, a locksmith of no fixed abode, was charged with vagrancy. (His headgear was like a straw lampshade!). P.C. Barker arrested him at Mount View, High Street, and as he walked him down the road women said he had been begging, pretending to be deaf and dumb. He was kept overnight in Matlock Bath lock-up. He had 3s 1/2d (15p) on him. That day he had started at Brightgate at 7am having slept in a hedge. The previous night he had just walked around. He had begged at every house in Uppertown. He was sentenced to 14 days hard labour.

Several boys were bathing in Becks Mere (off Salters Lane) in water between 3' and 16' deep, when one fell in. Councillor Harrison's son, George,11, dived in fully clothed and rescued him. This "plucky" act initiated a recommendation to the Royal Humane Society which resulted in their Award to him in December 1916.

PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council met on Tuesday 16 August at 7.30pm at the Village Hall. Councillors had planned to use the time at the August meeting for a walk around the village to have site visits to any areas of concern. As none had been identified, Councillors spent the time on a site visit to the Park and Park Bottom and in an initial discussion about the future of the lease of the Park. Derbyshire Dales District Council held the lease for the Park (which includes the bank up to the boundary of the school grounds) from the landowners, Derby Diocese, up until 2014. As the lease has run out, DDDC and the Diocese have asked if the Parish Council would be prepared to take over the lease and responsibility for the land. Initial information has been received about what this would constitute and the Parish Council would, for an annual rent, take responsibility for the maintenance and management of the land, with a licence to DDDC for the play area so that DDDC would continue to be responsible for the play equipment. Under the terms of the proposed lease, the Parish Council would take on the management of the trees on the bank, mowing and maintenance of the remaining area, including the recently upgraded village parking area. This would mean that the Parish Council could apply parking restrictions on that area. There would be cost implications from the Parish Council budget, as apart from the rent, the area would require significantly more time than is currently allocated and it is likely that additional contractors would be needed. Councillors are aware that this is a decision which is likely to have a considerable impact on the village and in the light of this would be keen to hear your opinions on this issue. You can contact your Councillors via the details at the side of the page, and the decision is due to be made at the next meeting on 20 September at 7.30 pm

at Bonsall Village Hall, everyone welcome to come and make their views known there. If you would like any further information in the meantime, please feel free to contact the Clerk.




