# 'Schools Out for Summer, Schools out forever!'

Well it is that time of year again. The last chime of the school bell has been rung and the 6 weeks hols have begun. For those still at school, this is the truest holiday. There are no more exams, no more homework to be done and no real attention given to what may be happening come September. For those parents of children at school, the 6 weeks can be quite daunting when you see the days lined up before you on the calendar and wonder what can you do to fill them for your children. There may be a week's holiday, and the odd event or day out. Perhaps a visit to family or a football holiday club. But every parent will know it is impossible to fill every day, and invariably sooner or later those words every parent hates to hear, will be uttered... 'I'm bored!!' We do not hold too much sympathy for bored children, we look at them and think I wish I had enough free time to feel bored, so we send them outside and watch them wander aimlessly around the garden until it is time for the next meal or time for them to go on their iPads. We might get frustrated with our bored kids, but how much boredom is there in your life? 'Well I am too busy to be bored!!!' You might say. But please, please, don't think that boredom is laziness. Boredom is a lack of interest in the thing or things that you are doing. You may work hard for 50 hours a week and still be completely bored. People become disinterested in all kinds

of areas of life. It is so easy to stop finding joy in our work, in our free time and sadly, sometimes in the people we love. Boredom can creep up on us and cost us years of our lives if we are not careful. So what can be done about it? Firstly, assess your boredom. Most people never give themselves a chance to ask questions about their lives, to see if they are really happy. The bible is full of encouragement for 'stillness'. To just stop, be quiet, and reflect. We live in a society where we have to constantly fill our 'stillness', to the point where we can't even go up an escalator without checking our emails, or we can't walk through the countryside without a continuous soundtrack pumping in our ears. When was the last time you were truly still? Secondly, find the joy again in the things and the people in your life. The only way to do this is through something called 'gratitude.' The bible encourages us 'Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is lovely... think about these things' It is easy to be cynical and negative, but your life will be full of many good things, and sometimes we have to be disciplined to remember them. But once we begin to see them and appreciate them afresh, it reminds of the joy in our life. Finally if your life is full of boredom, maybe you need to fill it with different things. If you can't find joy in your work, maybe it's time for a new job, if you can't find joy in your free time, maybe it's time for a new hobby. The bible tells me about Jesus 'I have come that you might have life in ALL IT'S FULLNESS.' So if boredom persists, maybe it's time to meet Jesus.



# 100 YEARS AGO

Anthony Land was a stonemason in Bonsall, married to Mary née Jones. Their son Anthony Land was a coachman initially at Cromford but by the start of the war he was living in Derby. He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery, which used horses in great numbers (we have all seen War Horse). Later he transferred to the Manchester regiment and by 1918 he had transferred again to the 1/8th Battalion Middlesex Regiment. In preparation for an attack on the German defences (Hindenburg Line), assaults on strongpoints were undertaken. On August 24th his battalion advanced at Blairville, south of Arras, after an artillery barrage and achieved their objective (with the loss of 3 officers and 51 men killed or wounded). However the enemy put up a stiff resistance and they were forced back to their starting position. In this phase of the action a further 120 casualties were incurred. Anthony Land was one of those killed and his body was recovered and he was buried near where he fell. He was aged 37.

Benjamin Gratton was a lead miner and at the age of 27 married Mary Elliott in 1886. He was the son of a lead miner and became a mine deputy at Mill Close Mine. They had four children including Walter born in 1893. In addition to being a lead miner Benjamin had a smallholding and built the terrace of Rose Cottages in Uppertown where the family lived in No 3. When Walter left school he worked in the quarries.

His older brother Horace had been a Territorial soldier and enlisted at the start of the war in the 6th battalion Sherwood Foresters. He survived the war. Walter also joined the 6th Battalion.

In preparation for the attack on the Hindenburg Line the strongpoints covering the Loisne River had to be taken. The 6th Battalion spent some months in an area subject to gas shelling which meant gas marks had to be worn continuously. After a night sheltering in shell holes the patrols advanced at dawn on August 31st and by a series of rushes established a salient in the enemy line. However this meant they were subjected to enemy fire from three directions. They took what cover they could and during this engagement Walter was killed. His body was recovered and he was buried nearby. He was aged25.

At home Mr. William Walker. landlord of the Barley Mow for over 25 years died. He was 65 years of age but had not enjoyed good health for a considerable time.

It was reported that GH Key, owner of the Via Gellia Colour Company, had bought, from the Gell family, 1500 acres of land being both sides of the Via Gellia from the Pig of Lead to the Hollybush at Grangemill.

# Potholes and road conditions

A letter was read out from a member of the public; the letter expressed deep concern that a cyclist had recently been killed and another injured in accidents involving a pothole in Cromford.

County Councillor Ratcliffe also expressed her concern, and agreed to pass on the letter to the County Council and take up the issue.

Councillor Ratcliffe reported that resurfacing of Uppertown Lane was now included in the Capital programme, but she did not have a timescale for

completion. Work to potholes on Slaley lane and the Dale and on the Clatterway had now been completed.

# **Defibrillators**

The fundraising target for two new defibrillators at Town Head and the Dale has now been reached; £2574 has been raised to date. They will be installed on site in the next few weeks. Councillors recorded thanks to all who had donated, and for the work of Richard Taylor in organising recent donations. It was also reported that Richard was hoping to start fundraising later in the year for a further unit at the school/Church Street.

# Arts Trail

A proposal from a local artist Amanda Graham to develop a village Arts Trail was outlined. Marion Heasman on behalf of the Arts group explained that a similar project had operated in the past, and she would be keen to be involved in discussions on this. It was agreed that in principle the idea should be welcomed, and the Parish Council would wait to hear from Marion as to further developments. # Improvements to Via Gellia

The Department of Transport has announced a grant of £3 million for improvement to the Via Gellia from Cromford to Newhaven. Safety upgrade work was likely to include the construction of a new roundabout

(location not known), installation of average speed cameras, junction improvements lane widening and verge clearance, and extra road hatchings. The work may not be scheduled until 2021/22. The improvement scheme was welcomed, subject to seeing the details and ensuring that implementation works were well managed to avoid disruption to traffic and local businesses.

# **Dog control**

There was a report on dog control in the village and the key points are here for information:

# **District Council Dog Control Orders:**

the District Council, have designated various areas throughout the District as subject to dog control orders. In Bonsall these are:

- Bonsall Recreation Ground
- Clatterway Memorial Gardens
- Yeoman Street
- Bandstand at the Cross
- Yeoman Street Old School Yard
- The Dale
- Nether Green
- Clatterway
- Horsedale Path, The Dale

The control order on these sites requires dogs to be on a lead and prohibits fouling. The exception is the Recreation Ground, where dogs are excluded from the children's play area, dog fouling is prohibited throughout the park, and outside the children's play area dogs are only required to be on a lead 'By Direction'. This means that if a Council

worker directs the owner to put a dog on a lead it is an offence not to.

**Enforcement:** All of these orders are enforced by the Council, so offences would be reported to District Council Environmental Health (environmenthotline@derbyshiredales. gov.uk; 01629 761215)

**General fouling complaints:** there is also a facility on the District Council website to report general dog fouling; http://www.derbyshiredales.gov. uk/environment-and-waste/roads/street-care-and-cleaning/dog-fouling/report-it.

The report form asks for details such as the name and address of the owner, if known. This would be the route to follow for persistent dog fouling problems.


