Derbyshire County Council Coronavirus update

Chesterfield, North East Derbyshire and Erewash will enter the 'High' covid local alert level after a surge in coronavirus cases it has been announced by the Government.

Although cases are rising across Derbyshire, cases in the three areas remain among the highest in the county.

The extra restrictions will start at 12.01am Saturday 17 October.

The three areas join parts of the High Peak, where Glossopdale was placed in 'High' covid alert level on Wednesday 14 October.

The announcement comes after discussions between the Government, council leaders and MPs on how to manage the infection rate rise in the three districts.

As well as following the continued guidance to wash hands, stay apart and wear a face covering it means:

- different households or support bubbles should not mix indoors – at home, someone else's home, pubs, restaurants, hotels or other hospitality venues, leisure venues or shops.
- outdoors people should stick to the Rule of Six, including children.
- if going on holiday, this should only be with the people they live with or that are in their support bubble
- family and friends can provide informal childcare as part of a childcare bubble. The bubble is limited to two households only so that informal childcare is provided by the same carers each time
- only visit care homes in exceptional circumstances
- all businesses, leisure facilities and other places which are allowed to open by law can remain open providing they meet Covid-19 secure guidance
- pubs, bars restaurants and other hospitality venues close at 10pm. Drive-through services, click and collect and delivery services can continue after 10pm
- you can take part in sport and physical activity outdoors but organised indoor exercise classes are only permitted if it's possible to avoid mixing with people you don't live with or share a support bubble with. There are exceptions for children and people with a disability

Report for 20 October 2020 meeting

Motocross site former White Low mine:

a member of the Bonsall Moor Action group told the Council that they had conducted a survey the previous Sunday morning, which showed a high level of traffic and vehicles speeding through Slaley associated with the motocross site. There was concern about the impact on quality of life for residents and safety of road users, and in particular cyclists, as the survey showed that a lot of cyclists were using the road at that time. Some incidents of aggressive driving were also reported. The road surface at Black Tor road was in poor condition with erosion and potholes due to additional use.

Councillor Garry Purdy said that these were all issues for the highways department and the police, and he gave contact details for that. Cllr Ratcliffe said that she would raise the problem with the local police and Police and Crime Commissioner, and that she had reported the road surface problem.

Councillor Joyce Pawley said that the District Council Environmental Health team were continuing to respond to complaints about noise and also potential soil pollution. There was no news on the enforcement appeal date.

The Chair reported that there had been a lot of activity at the weekend and Monday/Tuesday, and that he had received three complaints in relation to noise levels. The Council agreed to use additional Twenty's Plenty signage around Slaley to try to reduce traffic speeding.

Street light repair: the light at the park bus shelter has been out of operation for at least 18 months; the delay is said to be due to Western Power who have been asked by the County Council to make a new power connection. It was agreed to lodge a complaint with the Council to try to get some progress on this.

Gully sweeping on Clatterway: leaf fall on the Clatterway is causing problems again and the District Council sweeping service is not frequent enough to deal with it. There was concern that residents would be less likely to undertake voluntary clearance work once charging for green bins commenced, and it was agreed to ask the Council to provide bags and free collection for leaves cleared by volunteers from the highway.

Flood sacks: the Council has had a grant of £200 from the District Council Local Projects Fund towards more flood sacks,

and Councillors Pawley and Purdy were thanked for their help in securing that. If anyone needs these sacks, please contact either your local Councillor or the Clerk so that we can gauge how many to purchase. We also have some available that were donated by the County Council, and if anyone wants these please contact either the Clerk or Councillor Mark Harris.

Speed gun for the village: the Council has previously operated the Speedwatch scheme to informally monitor and discourage vehicle speeding. Previously this had to be done with police presence, but speed guns are now being made available to communities to operate themselves by trained volunteers. Similar schemes have commenced in Matlock and Matlock Bath, and the Parish Council has agreed to purchase a unit for the village at a cost of £500. The Council is expected to get a grant of £200 from the County Council towards the cost of that.

Grant applications for village projects: the Parish Council has a small grant fund for group's organisations or projects that will benefit the local area or community. There have been no requests for funding so far this year, so if any group wishes to apply then they should contact the Clerk or local Councillor. The Council cannot give support to individuals, profit making or commercial organisations.

Local Government reorganisation: Councillor Purdy said that the government had recently announced that the review process was being suspended, and had indicated that the 'Vision for Derbyshire' proposal was likely to be accepted, which would mean retention of the County Council and District Councils for the future.

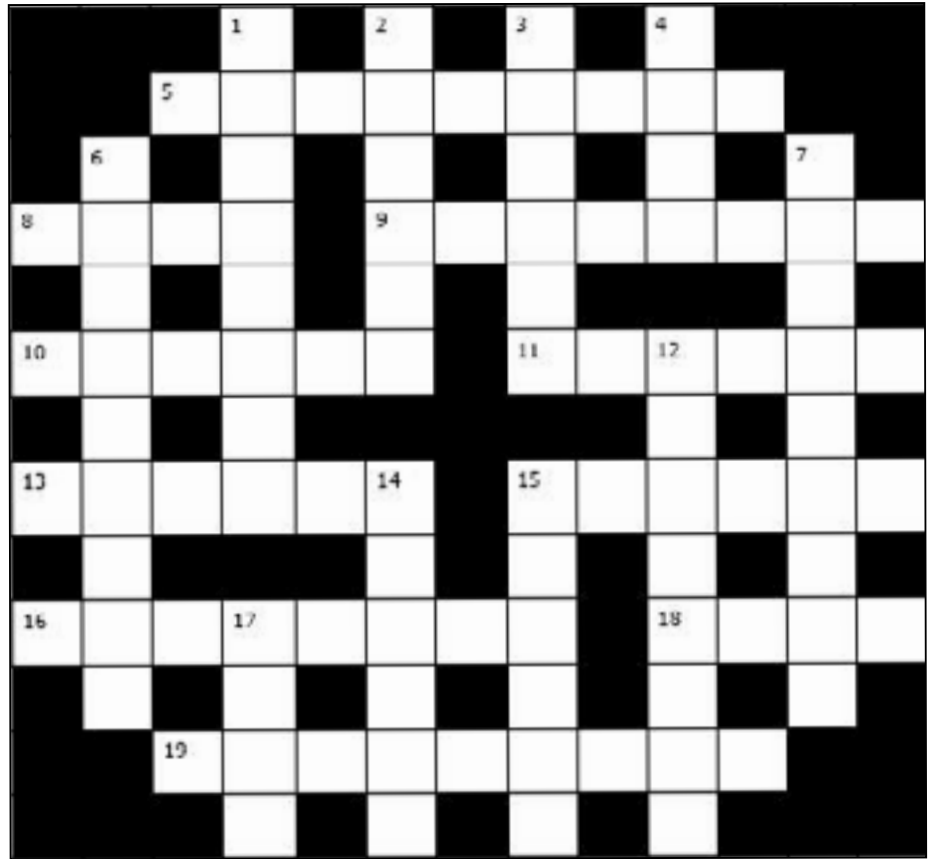
