Jon Barry finds national fame

In case you missed it, Jon's shed on Bell Lane was featured in The Guardian in a very enthusiastic way!

(see Peace in the Peak District: walking the Limestone Way by Hugh Thomson. Guardian online, Wed 9 Jun 2021. www.theguardian. com/travel/2021/jun/09/ peak-district-walking-the-limestone-way-trail-ancient-tracks).

"Coming to Uppertown, I was amused by one of the most ambitious sheds I've ever come across. I like to think of myself as a bit of a shed connoisseur – but this was an uber-shed. Its sides were decorated with bric-a-brac from a thousand car boot sales, and large signs proclaimed that at one and the same time it was an RAC hostel, a small post office and a mining hut; in case anyone fell into the sea many hundreds of miles away, there was also a prominent lifebuoy, with a union jack flying nearby to proclaim eccentricity rather than nationalism.

The final stretch takes you down Stepping Lane between the lines of two dry stone walls to arrive in Bonsall at the Kings Head, right next to the village cross, for some welcome refreshments. The Limestone Way continues on from here towards Tissington, but you've just walked the best of it. And if you're still feeling adventurous, Bonsall is one of the UFO capitals of Britain – no less than 19 sightings in one year alone - so if you don't manage to see any spinning circles overhead, you can at least enjoy a second pint at the nearby Barley Mow, where the UFO-spotters often congregate; just remember to wear an anorak and carry night-vision goggles if you want to blend in."

Nepal Revisited COVID Appeal – Change of date

An illustrated talk by Chris Broome and Alan and Jane David in Bonsall Village Hall on Tuesday 27 July at 7.30pm. Note that this date may change if the Government delay the ending of COVID restrictions on the 19 July.

Some of you may have attended the illustrated talks that Chris, Jane and I have given in previous years after our various trips to Nepal organised and led by our friend Bijay. The main purpose of this event is to raise awareness of the worsening COVID situation in Nepal and hopefully raise some money to help the Nepalese people, in particular our friend Bijay and his family and friends in his home village of Tamang Tol. We also intend to show some photographic highlights from our trips to Nepal in 2014, 2017 and 2019.

Chris, Jane and I have regular video calls with Bijay. It is apparent from our conversations that the COVID situation in Nepal is becoming serious, mainly due to the spread of the Indian Variant from the Indian sub-continent into Nepal. Unlike in the UK, where we are on the road to recovery from the virus, COVID has not yet reached its peak in Nepal and is likely to be a problem in the country for some time to come. The Nepalese economy is suffering greatly due to lack of tourism, as there hasn't been any trekking in Nepal since March 2020. As a result, work is difficult to find and food is becoming more difficult to buy.

Nepal's COVID vaccination programme seems woefully inadequate to help prevent the spread of the virus through the country. We are told by Bijay that many people there, including his family,

do not want to have the vaccine at present as currently the only vaccine available to them (at a cost) comes from China and apparently doesn't have WHO approval. Bijay and his family members who were living in Kathmandu have recently had to return to their home village, as instructed by the government, to 'isolate' with his family. Nobody knows how long they will have to stay there.

Food is a major concern as many people are not able to earn money from selling produce in the local markets as these are all closed and many people don't have savings to fall back on. Much less produce is getting into the country from India (the main source of imported food) so prices are likely to increase as supplies run low.

There will be no entrance fee for attending the event but any monetary donations will be gratefully received. All money raised will be sent by ourselves direct to Bijay. Over the years we have got to know Bijay we have come to the realisation that he is completely trustworthy and know that the money will go directly to the people in his village who need it most.

Refreshments will be provided (if allowed by COVID restrictions at the time). There will also be a raffle.

The event will follow the government guidelines on COVID current at the time, including social distancing rules.

We hope that you will be able to come along and support this event and have an enjoyable evening.



Parish Council Report for meeting on 15 June 2021



Motocross site; lead contamination levels

The Council had received the results of independent soil testing of the BMMX site which was commissioned by the District Council Environmental Health Department at four locations across the site, as shown on their plan. Samples were tested for a number of metals, and for all but lead, guidance values were not exceeded. However, for lead, the 'low risk' guidance value of 1340 mg/kg was exceeded at each location, and results ranged from 9520 to 15300 mg/kg of lead across site. These were described by Councillor Purdy as "high" lead levels, and as a result the District Council have requested urgent action from the organisers to deal with the health issues for users of the site and adjacent land. The full test report is available on the Parish Council website.

A member of the public expressed serious concern at the use of the site by children for the 'BMMX Kids Night' on Tuesdays, in the light of those findings. Councillor Purdy said that the District Council could only stop activities if the results showed that the levels were sufficiently dangerous to health, and that was still to be determined, but that Health Officers were working on it urgently and that the organisers had been instructed to deal with it urgently.

The landowner of the track said that their own lead reports had returned as satisfactory. The organisers intended to undertake air monitoring and to continue with dust suppression. The landowner said that he intended to reinstate the highway surface on the track to the site from Grangemill to allow access to the site from that direction. Councillor Purdy cautioned him against this action as he said that it was a public highway which was managed by the County Council. The landowner expressed concern that the signage at the cattle grid from Bonsall Lane was causing track customers not to take that route, and a client had damaged their vehicle attempting access via Blakelow Lane, and that was why he was taking this action.

The landowner also circulated papers showing Environment Agency action taken against a nearby landowner in relation to a pollution risk from burning of unpermitted waste on a quarry site, which could impact on water supplies. The papers showed that the quarry owner had been required to stop waste burning activities. The landowner asked the Parish Council to intervene on this; the Chair and Cllr Purdy said that these were not issues that the Parish Council could get involved with, as it was already being dealt with by the Environment Agency and would need to be taken up with them.

Litter and weed collecting

Volunteers are welcome to help with litter collection and weeding of the highway edges. Collection bags are available from Councillors or the Clerk.

Passing places Salters Lane

Following a request from a resident it was agreed to ask the County Council to provide additional signage to prevent parking in passing places on Salters lane, particularly in the area below Jugholes.

Website

There is a working group looking to develop the village website and new members would be welcome; anyone interested please contact the clerk.

Appointment of new Councillor

There is still a vacancy, and if you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please contact the clerk Tony Payne. Applications would be considered at the next Parish Council meeting.

Refuse collection problems

District Council leader Garry Purdy said that the Council was very aware of the problems across the District with refuse collection and in particular recycling waste collection, and apologised for that. He said that the principal problems were that SERCO had lost staff due to Covid, that Covid had required vehicle crews to be re-arranged with more vehicles required to avoid three sharing a cab, and that this was compounded by a national shortage of HGV drivers. That in turn, he said, was caused by Brexit, non-UK drivers not being willing to come to the UK due to the pandemic, and HGV training having only recently re-commenced. SERCO had put out 40 adverts for drivers with no response, and refuse collection jobs were being avoided by drivers due to the need to share cabs. He said that it was a national problem which could get worse before it got better.

The District Council had started legal action to enforce their contract with SERCO, and public announcements on action to be taken would be made soon.

Councillors asked whether residents could be leafleted with updates on information by the bin crews, and Councillor Purdy said that he would ask if that could be done.

Councillors also queried whether this was the full explanation of difficulties, quoting examples that day of two crews arriving to collect recycling bins on the same road.

Speeding on the Dale/ Speedwatch

A resident spoke about her neighbour's cat being killed by a speeding driver on the Dale, and asked whether speed humps or 'No footpath' signs could be installed. It was explained that the County Council had recently turned down a request for that signage. The Parish Council's 'Speedwatch' scheme is being reactivated using the new speed gun, and speed monitoring should be starting soon.

Slinter top quarry

Councillor Grover reported that he had checked the County Council website that day and found that there was a new submission from the quarry company which was out for public consultation. The Clerk confirmed that the Parish Council had not been consulted on this, and it was agreed to write to the County Council to complain at lack of consultation for the Council and residents, and request the opportunity to comment.

The new document covers an updated ecology report, newt survey, and noise data, including for the village. Representations are stated to be needed by 14 July 2021 (although DCC say later submissions will be accepted).




