

The Fountain Tea Rooms: A little more History

In 1841 the building was a pub, known as 'The New Inn'. The landlord was George Higgott, then aged 76. He lived with his wife, Elizabeth, aged 69. When the census was taken that year, 9-year-old Mary Crowther was staying with them. Perhaps she was a granddaughter.

The Bonsall Tithe Map of 1848 lists George as the owner and Josiah Oliver as the tenant of the New Inn. George died in 1849 aged 83 and Elizabeth in 1856, aged 82. They are buried together in St James' church yard.

By 1851, Josiah Oliver was 32 and was listed as the publican and a framework knitter. He may have trained under his father, William, also a framework knitter who lived in the Dale. He lived with his wife Ann, 32, and their children, Emma 7, and William 5. Mary Wardman 20 was also with them listed as a servant. Perhaps she was Ann's sister. Another family, possibly Ann's brother, lived at the same

10 years on, in 1861, Josiah was still the publican but was now also listed as a grocer. Emma, now 17, was a barmaid.



William, 15, was a green grocer, possibly working in the shop behind the pub. Two more children had been born: Josiah junior 8 and Colin 3.

In 1871, Josiah was still a publican and grocer but was also farming 7 acres. Emma, at 27, was a maid of all work. Josiah junior 18 was a carrier and Colin 13, was a scholar. William 26 was working as a farm servant in Duffield.

By 1881, Josiah was still a publican and farmer. Emma 37 was listed as a domestic and remained unmarried. Young Josiah, at 28, was married with three children and lived further along Yeoman Street. Colin 23 was working on the farm. Josiah's wife Ann was not mentioned but it is safe to assume she was running the home and helping in all areas, pub, shop and farm.

Josiah died in 1883 at the age of 63 and was buried in Bonsall. The inscription on his headstone suggests he was a well liked man. His wife, Ann, took over the running

of the pub and the farm. Daughter, Emma, now 48 and son, Colin 33, both worked as assistants. Ann also employed Jack Poundall, 46, as a farm servant.

Josiah Oliver left a personal estate of £198 16s 10d and probate was proved by two of his sons and executors, William, in Duffleld and Colin in Bonsall, both listed as farmers.

Frank Millward and his wife Clara, grocers, may have taken over the shop behind the pub.

Ann died in 1895, aged 76 and was buried in Bonsall with Josiah.

By 1901 her youngest son, Colin 43 was the publican and the New Inn had been renamed The Fountain Inn. Colin was still working on the farm and was helped by his wife, Edith, also 43. They had one daughter, Annie 8. They continued through 1911 and beyond, by which time Annie 18 was doing dairy work on the farm.

Emma, Colin's older sister, never married and died aged 57 in the Fountain Inn in 1900, having spent her whole life working with her father, mother and finally brother at the pub.

Colin died in 1932 aged 74 and the Inn finally passed into other hands.

Parish Council Report for meeting **17 August 2021**

Volunteering: there is an opportunity to undertake some volunteer work helping to improve the vacant District Council owned plot of land on Yeoman Street (up from the garage) on the weekend of 25/26 September. Please contact the Clerk or Councillor Richard Grover for more information

Litter and weed collecting: volunteers are also welcome to help with litter collection and weeding of the highway edges. Collection bags are available from Councillors or the Clerk. The Parish Council has agreed with the District that the highway verges won't be sprayed and that the volunteer scheme will apply instead; Councillors were keen to encourage participation in this to avoid the pavement and wall edges getting overgrown.

Appointment of new Councillor: there is still a vacancy, and if you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor please contact the clerk.

New park goal posts: one of the goalposts has had to be removed as it had rusted through and was unsafe. It was agreed to purchase a new set of junior posts from Harrod Sport, with nets and net supports, at a total cost of £1028 plus VAT (recoverable) and delivery costs. Two posts were purchased as there were considerable savings as against buying single posts, and the condition of the remaining post could not be guaranteed.

Sponsorship: the Council would welcome interest from anyone wanting to sponsor the new goals and nets; please contact a Councillor or the clerk.

Vehicle park management: The Council received a report from the vehicle park working group and agreed to the following:

- Signage: Jon Ogilvy agreed to produce outline costs for the next meeting for a village vehicle park sign in the style and size of the village walks maps, illustrating the features and facilities of the village, to be located near the park entrance and post-mounted. A smaller A3/A4 sign is to be post-mounted next to the charge collection box detailing charges for use. It was also agreed to install 'Village Parking' finger post or similar to be visible from the

8' container unit on the vehicle park. and that the Council had been asked to "please think carefully about the precise siting, external treatment and landscaping to ensure that the impacts on the Conservation Area are minimised". It was agreed that: (1) the unit should be in the far right corner when viewed from the vehicle park entrance, to be set against the hedge as far as possible to reduce visual impact; (2) to be screened with wooden panelling - either once purchased or supplied with panels dependent upon cost. The Chair reported that he had been unable to find a new unit within the approved £2000 budget; Cllr Barry offered to make some more enquiries for a second hand container. Anyone with knowledge of a suitable unit for sale (20 foot) is asked to contact the Council.

- Charge box: Carl Taylor had offered to build a stone pillar of local stone on a mortar base with the charge box mounted in it. The box was to be sited on the left hand side of the entrance.
- Vehicle park policy: issues of potential abuse of the charging system were discussed. It was agreed that the Council would need to prepare a policy to govern charge recovery, granting of resident permits etc, and that this would be done through the working group.

Refuse collection: Cllr Purdy explained the decision which had been narrowly agreed by the District Council to contribute 50% towards the cost of a pay increase for HGV drivers to encourage recruitment and retention. He said that this would not by itself solve the problem, which was a national issue caused by the pandemic and Brexit amongst other factors. He said that it required government intervention on issues such as training. In response to questions about communicating information on missed bins, Cllr Purdy said that a leaflet was being sent out, and also advised people to sign up on the website for the District Council newsletter: Derbyshire Dales District Council (list-manage.com)

County Council flood prevention work: the County Council had now advised that they had started looking in detail at the Bonsall area and that a repair scheme on Yeoman Street has been raised, currently planned to start at the beginning of September. It was agreed to seek further details of the scheme, in particular to seek to ensure that the Yeoman Street work addressed the general problem of the road surface condition, which appeared to being caused by the culvert.

Motocross site former White Low **mine:** complaints had been received from residents about noise from the track on the

afternoon and evening of Wednesday 11 August.

Amended position on lead issues: the Clerk reported a complaint received from the track operators about the fact that the minutes of the last meeting recorded that Councillors expressed concern about the continued holding of children's events on the site despite the District Council having advised the operator to stop such events because of the high lead levels. It was agreed to write to the District Council to express concern on these issues and to seek further information on action being taken. That was based on an email from a District Council Environmental Health Officer, which had been reported to the July meeting, stating that we have advised them to suspend all activities for children.

The complaint said that nobody from any council whatsoever has been in contact to advise us to 'stop' holding children's events. As a result, the District Council was asked to clarify this, and had now advised that their full wording to the operator was:

'You should also consider young people under 18 years, and woman of reproductive capacity – this demographic is more sensitive to lead exposure, and you should consider withdrawing services for this demographic until you know more about the risks involved. The Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1999, Regulations 16 and 19'.

In relation to their having continued to provide children's sessions, the operators have stated that "We have been asked to 'consider withdrawing' until we have an official risk assessment by a professional body. By which we have taken that advice and appointed an appropriate person". The full amended position in relation to the District Council wording on lead issues for children and women, and the response of the operators, was noted for the record. Councillor Purdy advised the meeting that the track was currently closed, but that the District Council were not able to respond at present to the Parish Council's request for information in relation to their cur-






