What you need to know about Christians and the church, is that we are all flawed and imperfect people worshipping and serving, a loving and perfect God. So the failings and hypocrisy of Christians do not reflect a failure of God. In fact it should highlight his love and grace that he still loves us despite the mess we sometimes make.

And that is why I choose to celebrate Jesus this Easter. Because 'God so loved the world, that he gave his one and only Son.' A beautiful and powerful gift borne out of love, to draw mankind back to himself.

So I celebrate Easter not because I am bad and need God's mercy, but because He is good and gives his love generously.

OBITUARY



Ruby Gratton: 1930 - 2022

Ruby was born in Bonsall on the Holly Finnis on 16 October 1930. She was the youngest daughter of John and Eliza Taylor and had 3 sisters Winnie, Joyce and May.

She attended Bonsall Girls School and when she left at the age of 14 she worked first at Hollins Mill on the Via Gellia and then Masson Mills at Matlock Bath.

She met her future husband Butch, a farmer, at the Masson Mill dances. They were married in June 1952 and lived at Bottom Leys Farm until 1958 before moving to Uppertown and Brumlea Farm. When living on the Leys she would walk up and down the fields to Horsedale each day to catch the bus from the Fountain to her work at Masson.

In 1954 she left Masson when her first daughter Denise was born, followed by Lynn in 1956, Beverley 1957, Jill 1961, Valerie 1962, Norma 1963 and Mandy in 1967. A son never having arrived it was the Gratton girls who worked alongside Butch on the Farm, whilst Ruby ran the large household with military precision. The girls were always a source of pride to both Butch and Ruby.

Butch was a very competitive dart player and played in several different leagues. Ruby went with him as a supporter and in 1975 started to play herself when she joined the Kings Head Darts and Domino Team along with some of her girls. She was also very competitive, as her children and grandchildren can attest. No-one was ever allowed to win a game of cards, dominoes or board game other than on merit.

She had many hobbies over the years including dancing, flower arranging, patchwork, embroidery, line dancing, reading and of course her many holidays. Back in the day she was an active member of the Bonsall Young Wives Group, always happy to meet with her friends in the Village. Ruby was often referred to as being a glamourous lady and insisted on having her hair and nails done right up to her death. She loved clothes and was a bit of an Imelda Marcos when it came to shoes. It was not unknown for her to purchase multiple pairs of the same style in different colours!

When Butch died suddenly in 2001 Ruby was devastated. She had lost her soul mate and always said that wherever he went she would be hanging onto his shirt tail. After 6 months she decided to move from the Farm and whilst she was on holiday for 6 weeks in Australia with her sister Joyce (Butch, Ruby, Joyce and George had always talked about going there together) the bungalow on Black Tor Road was purchased for her. She lived happily there until her death.

Always an independent person she found it hard when her illness took her independence away and she had to rely on others. She bravely faced each day and, as each challenge came along, she was always pleased to find a solution to help her overcome small tasks.

In addition to her 7 daughters she had 18 grandchildren and 23 great grandchildren. Everyone loved Grandma Ruby and each one has their own fond memories of happy times with Grandma.

Ruby was blessed to have many good friends in the Village and the surrounding local area where she was well known. Her family and friends were a great joy to Ruby and a source of comfort after the death of Butch. She will be remembered as a happy and caring person, always having a smile for everyone. Bonsall "born and bred" she loved the place she lived all her life and would often recount tales on its history and former residents. Bonsall has lost one of its true characters.

Chernobyl Children's Lifeline CCLL Ukraine Crisis Fund On behalf of the Bonsall & Derbyshire

Dales Link, I would like to extend a big thank you to everyone who came along to the Quiz Night at the village hall on the 11 March, and to those who later made a donation to the Ukraine Crisis Appeal. We raised a magnificent £700. This money and some extra donations I have received from people outside the village meant that I was able to give £1,000 to the Chernobyl Children's Lifeline Ukraine Crisis Appeal. The money in this fund is being used currently to assist children and their families in the war torn areas of Ukraine. We are sending in urgent aid including medicines, food, nappies, sanitary products etc. using our partners and contacts in the areas where we bring groups of children over in 'normal' times. We are also assisting with the evacuation of children who are sick or are injured from the bombing and who need urgent medical attention in hospitals in Poland and Germany. More aid is urgently needed and I am looking into the possibility of taking out a minibus full of aid to Chelm in Poland and then using the minibus to transport children with accompanying adults hopefully back to England under the Homes for Ukraine scheme. I am also looking to match up Sponsors in the Bonsall area with refugee families - they can't start to apply for UK Visas until they have a sponsor. Sadly, CCLL will not be acting as a Sponsor under this scheme, at least for the time being. They don't have the necessary funds nor the resources to take this on, not at the present time anyway. I have had over 60 families in the area come forward to offer their homes for the refugees. This is quite remarkable. Hopefully, we can start to pair up these sponsors with Ukrainian refugees in the near future so that the Ukraine families can get away from the very difficult conditions they are currently experiencing in Ukraine but also in Poland and Slovakia where they are being temporarily 'housed' in gymnasiums, sports halls and other such premises by the thousands. Many families want to stay close to Ukraine for the time being. They will soon need to be able to move on and for some of them to come to the UK. Many of them are traumatised and will need professional help once in the UK. Let's hope they will be able to get their visas soon. I am sure that Bonsall & surrounding towns and villages will make them very welcome in our communities.

Report for 15th March 2022 meeting

Refuse collection

Councillor Purdy referred to the independent report into the SERCO contract which he said showed that Serco were responsible for the collection problems that had occurred. He said that there were continuing problems, that the Council were looking at different options for the future, and that residents should continue to report problems with collection.

Bankside

Councillor Murphy said he had passed on the Parish Council's request for additional signage and was waiting for a response. Councillor Addis reported that another HGV had become stuck on the lane the previous weekend, and that the retaining wall was now bulging. This had also been reported to the County Council. Councillor Murphy agreed to chase progress on this.

Slinter Quarry

Application CM3/0817/40 extension of the quarry to the south west: the Clerk reported five complaints from residents about recent noise levels attributed to the quarry, and objecting to the delays in resolving the planning issues and the processes adopted.

Councillor Murphy said that the County Council were still assessing the responses to the Environmental Impact consultation to which the Parish Council had responded in January 2022. In relation to the application for time extension on the current permission, Councillor Murphy said that this was being held in abeyance until it is considered to be a valid planning application. He said that the Council must follow statutory guidance and the Environmental Impact Regulations, and could not proceed until all information was available or they would be vulnerable to legal challenge.

The Council agreed to request a further update from the County Council on progress with the current applications.

Jubilee grant

There is District Council grant funding up to £500 available for groups organising Jubilee events. The application for the grant would be made by the Parish Council, and any group organising an event who wishes to apply for this funding should contact the Parish Council.

Village Hall

Councillor Jackie Smith reported that the Village Hall Committee was applying for lottery funding for a new disabled access and towards the cost of investigating structural problems at the front of the building. They were seeking Council

support for that application; Councillor Phil Addis proposed that the Council support the application and that was

Local Government Boundary Commission Ward Boundary Review 2nd Consultation

The Clerk explained that there was a second round of consultations by the Boundary Commission in relation to ward boundaries. It was agreed to submit again the comments agreed at the January meeting, requesting restoration of the link between Bonsall and Cromford.

Highway storm damage

Councillors discussed damage caused by recent storm water, in particular on Yeoman Street (where the road surface had lifted again), High Street and Clatterway. Residents Councillors and the Clerk had all reported damage to the County Council via their website, and the Council encourages people to report damage so as impress on the County Council the need for repairs. August meetings

The Council reviewed the meeting schedule, and have decided to adopt the approach of other similar Councils and not hold an August meeting unless there is urgent business. The Council has a Planning Committee that could meet to cover any applications arising during the


