Peak District National Park announces new electric vehicle charges to help drive lower emission journeys

The new EV chargers, located in some of the busiest sites across the National Park, will support zero emission journeys, while driving, for both tourists and the local community.

The new EV chargers were funded by BMW UK as part of its Recharge in Nature partnership with National Parks UK.

Through the partnership, BMW UK is also funding the Peak District National Park's 'Peaks of Health' initiative, from Spring 2024, which will support community-based health and wellbeing organisations to

make the National Park a more accessible space to walk, cycle and enjoy.

The Peak District National Park is charging forward, enhancing its accessibility to electric vehicles (EVs), with today marking the completion of the installation of five new twin charging points, funded by BMW UK through its Recharge in Nature partnership with National Parks UK.

The new EV chargers are located at Millers Dale Station, Parsley Hay Bike Hire Centre & Car Park and the Moorland Visitor Centre at Edale. Millers Dale Station and Parsley Hay chargers will be available to the public, and those at Edale will serve guests of the Fieldhead Campsite at the Moorland Visitor Centre.

These are some of the busiest locations in the National Park, increasing the availability of EV charging options for both local communities and visitors. Each EV charging point can charge two cars simultaneously meaning that more EV drivers can travel with confidence to appreciate the Peak District's picturesque views.



Defra funded grants for farmers and land owners

Successful support scheme for farmers to benefit climate, nature, people and place in the Peak District's special landscape is extended for one more year. Farmers and land managers in the Peak District National Park are being encouraged to continue to apply for funding to support landscape enhancement, access and conservation work through the Farming in Protected Landscapes (FiPL) programme. The national FiPL programme, administered locally by the Peak District National Park Authority, has been extended 12 months, to March 2025, with an extra £2.4 million available for farmers and land managers in the 2024/25 financial year. Since July 2021, the Peak District National Park has channelled £2 million to over 300 local farmers and land managers to bring benefits for climate, nature, people and place with an extra 1.2 million expected to be spent between now and April.

So far, the FiPL programme has supported 304 Peak District projects with works ranging from installing solar powered drinking troughs for livestock, creating habitat corridors for wildlife, to building a new hay barn to enable making late-cut, flower-rich hay, and planting close to 9kms of new hedgerows in the Hope Valley in association with the Hope Farmers Group. In total, 35 ponds have been



improved or created, 5511 trees planted, 49 historic structures conserved, restored or interpreted more effectively and 80 hectares of hay meadow restored. Educational access is being supported on 8 farms and 10 new permissive paths are in place.

The works bring benefits on the ground including supporting natural flood management, reducing carbon emissions from farms, improving areas for wildlife, and enhancing landscape features and historic assets. Many projects pave the way for enhanced opportunities for farmers to draw down funding from national schemes and/or enhance their business.

Phil Mulligan, chief executive of the Peak District National Park, said: "The National Park is a living, working landscape that supports communities and businesses, and is home to a huge range of habitats and species. It's also a place enjoyed by millions of visitors and residents every year. The FiPL programme has made it possible for us to support one-off projects that benefit

nature and cultural heritage-friendly farm businesses. "It's fantastic to see farmers taking up the opportunities to increase habitats, improve biodiversity, mitigate the impacts of climate change, and provide opportunities for people to enjoy and understand the landscape and its cultural heritage. It's about investing in the environment and people to help build sustainable farm businesses that look after the landscape now and for the future."

Some standout successes of the FiPL programme in the Peak District National Park to date include significant repairs to 300 metres of Doctor's Gate bridleway which protects sensitive moorland habitat; restoration of a stone-built Victorian water header tank structure at Sheldon; and support for the creation of wood pasture projects at Baslow and Hayfield and agro-forestry farming systems at Great Longstone, Green Fairfield and Wincle. At Minninglow, access off the High Peak trail has been provided to an award winning limekiln restoration project.

Funding is available for projects which deliver for one or more of the following themes: climate - including reducing flood risk; nature - targeting nature recovery; people - including enhanced access, volunteering, and ways to discover, enjoy and understand the landscape; place - including landscape, cultural heritage and support for increasing the resilience of nature friendly sustainable farm businesses.

The National Park team are particularly interested in hearing from farmers with ideas for projects that will deliver across the themes whilst supporting the development of their business, possibly through direct sales or enabling transition to a business model that can be supported more effectively through national schemes.

A local panel including farmer representatives assesses projects to ensure they provide value for money, a legacy from the work,

PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Council Report for meeting on **19 December 2023** and 16 January 2024

Public Speaking

Two members of the public presented a summary of the Bonsall Energy Group (BEG) community energy feasibility study.

BEG was formed in 2022 with a view of seeing what interest there might be in looking at potential renewable energy projects. Council for the Protection of the Rural Environment in conjunction with BEG produced a report in late 2022 setting out a vision for Bonsall. There were a number of potential options identified for renewable energy projects including wind turbine sites. BEG wishes to take the next step of undertaking a feasibility study to look in more details at these potential options and identify which, if any, would most benefit the community and be economically viable.

In order to apply for funding, BEG has registered with the Financial Conduct Authority as a Community Benefit Society and is about to apply for a Stage 1 grant from the Midlands Net Zero Hub Community Energy Fund for a CE Feasibility Study. BEG will prioritise scheme options with the focus being on wind and solar energy along with hydro, heat pumps and retrofit solar PV and electric vehicle charging points.

Community engagement via Mutterings is on-going and public meetings sessions are planned in the coming year.

The Cross

The Clerk is seeking further quotes for the necessary repairs. It was agreed to look for grants from heritage bodies to finance the necessary work.

Condition of roads

There has been much discussion about the terrible state of the roads in the village. BPC asked that representatives of DCC should visit and Parish Councillors walked them round Bonsall. Unfortunately, their response was disappointing. They said there is no budget for re-surfacing and the only option is for residents to report potholes via the DCC website. Cllr S Smith volunteered to collate a list of all the potholes in the village and make sure they are reported on the DCC website. He suggests residents report potholes to him via the village Matters Facebook page. The Clerk has also reported the signage problems during the recent roadworks on Via Gellia which resulted in large lorries becoming stuck in the village.

Grant

A grant of £250 for Mutterings was agreed.

Lime Trees in Churchyard

There was further discussion regarding next steps. Cllr Barry will meet with tree specialist in early February to seek a perspective on

- 1) clearing dead branches,
- 2) reducing height (pollarding) and
- 3) removing epicormic growth. A final position will be decided in February.




