I'm reminded of Charles Wesley's words in the hymn "Begone, unbelief, my Saviour is near, and for my relief will surely appear: by prayer let me wrestle and he will perform; with Christ in the vessel, I smile at the storm. 

The Bonsall Village Maypole

As many of you are aware, the Bonsall School PTFA was given a grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund to restore and recreate the maypole tradition in the village. The original maypole is long gone but thanks to the efforts of the school, PTFA and Claire Butler, our local maypole expert and teacher, the tradition has been re-introduced to the children, who thoroughly enjoyed their lessons and were keen to show their skills at the school Spring Fayre. The children's performance created a buzz of stories among older people in the crowd about how they used to dance around the maypole at school and different events, hence the decision to apply for the grant and bring back the maypole tradition to Bonsall.

The project has begun and many of you will have seen the beautiful new wooden maypole at Bonsall Carnival. This was created by Alan and Jason Pugh to whom we are extremely grateful for taking on the huge task and making the spectacular village maypole. Alan crafted the fabulous Bonsall Cross to top the pole. The artwork is still to be placed on the maypole which the children will be busily creating in their art lessons. It is anticipated that further dance lessons, talks and experiences for all ages, involving our pre-schoolers right up to our older members of the community, will be taking place in future months and volunteers will be trained to teach traditional dances. We would like to



collect oral histories and photographs from people who remember the maypole in the village from past decades. This information will be collated into a booklet to ensure the maypole heritage information is available for the future. To this end, if anyone has any memories or personal stories they would like to share, or any photographs of Bonsall's maypole tradition, please get in touch.







FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

Ingredients: 1 - Egg

340g - Mixed Fruit

115g - Sugar

115g - Butter or Margarine230g - Self Raising Flour

115ml - Water

Method:

Place Fruit, Sugar, Butter or Margarine and Water in a pan and simmer slowly for 20 minutes.

Allow to cool slightly & fold in the flour.

Turn into a greased 18cm (7") tin.

Bake in moderate oven Gas mark 4, 180°C (160°C fan) for approx 20 mins.

VICTORIA SPONGE RECIPE

Ingredients: 3 - Medium Eggs

170g - Butter or Margarine

170g - Caster Sugar170g - Self Raising Flour

For the filling: Fill with Raspberry jam

when cold.

Light dusting with caster

sugar to decorate.

Method:

Set oven to Gas mark 4 180°C (160°C fan)

Grease and base line the bottom of two 20cm (8") sandwich tins.

Cream Butter or Margarine and Sugar

Beat the eggs then gradually add to the mixture beating well each time.

Sieve the flour and fold into the mixture with a metal spoon

Divide equally between the two tins and bake for 25 minutes in the middle of the oven.

They are ready when golden, shrunk back from the sides of the tin and spring back when touched.

Remove from the tins when cold and fill with raspberry jam.

A light dusting of caster sugar on the top to finish (and to cover up mistakes!!)
