There is a good amount of availability for new groups to use the facilities.




Or. if anyone knows of anyone wanting to develop and run groups or hold events, please let us know as we are looking to expand the activities available.

Bonsall Energy Group

Bonsall Energy Group (BEG) is delighted to announce that we have successfully secured a grant from the Midlands Net Zero Hub's Community Energy Fund to conduct a feasibility study, exploring in detail which renewable energy generation options would benefit the village and the parish.

The study will focus on a small number of specific options identified in the CPRE community energy vision report and selected for their potential benefit to residents. The community energy vision process was a great opportunity for people in Bonsall to think together on the future energy needs of the village, how we might contribute to decarbonisation and what role renewable energy might play. BEG is excited to now be able to take the next step - exploring and presenting real options for the village to consider.

Following a competitive tendering process, we have selected T4 Sustainability Ltd, an Ilkeston-based renewables and environment company led by John Beardmore, to lead on the feasibility work.

The study is planned to take around 9 months to complete. Wind and solar generation options will be the main focus and potential sites within the parish have initial landowner support and interest. A micro hydro scheme at Via Gellia Mills was considered out of scope for this work as the generation capacity wasn't deemed likely to meet significant local needs and it is outside the Bonsall parish boundary.

During the study, we welcome and encourage the Bonsall community to engage with us and we look forward to being able to present the findings later in the year. We will also publish regular updates in Mutterings, on our website and on social media.

As a registered Community Benefit Society, BEG would be delighted to recruit more members. The one-off subscription to join the group is £10.00. We would also welcome people from the village who would like to contribute their time - all sorts of skills and knowledge are necessary! Our working group usually meets in the Kings Head pub on the second Tuesday of the month at 7.30pm and new members are very welcome. If you are interested in either of the above, please contact the Secretary, Pete Masters, or visit bonsallenergy.group.

Bonsall Dale 1851

Who lived in the Dale in 1851 and what did they do? According to census records, there were about 20 framework knitters, 4 seamstresses, probably family members, who helped assemble the knitted garments, 5 people employed in the textile factories, 1 comb maker, and several cordwainers (leather workers). Many of the remainder were lead miners.

William Oliver was a framework knitter who lived and worked in the Dale. The tithe map of 1848 shows that he owned the land from the entrance to Puddle Hill opposite the Barley Mow up to Yew Tree Farm. This included several houses, a waste bit, a pigsty and a framework knitters' workshop. The workshop has been renovated but is still recognisable by

the long windows needed in all workshops to maximise the light. It sits next to the house now known as 'Burnside'.

One of the houses was occupied by William's brother, John. He and two of his children, were framework knitters. Another house was rented by Humphrey Barnes. Humphrey's wife was a seamstress. He and a step-son were framework knitters. Another tenant, George Statham, was a butcher.

William's daughter was a framework knitter and lived with her father. His son, Josiah, was the landlord of the 'New Inn' (now the Fountain Tearooms). Josiah was another framework knitter who was about to take on an apprentice, Alfred Godbehere.

William and his neighbour, Silas Bunting of Yew Tree Farm and the 1737 workshop, must have known each other well. Silas, his daughter and one of his lodgers were framework knitters. Silas' first wife, Maria Woodward, was a sister of William's wife, Fanny Woodard, and William was a witness at Silas' and Maria's wedding. William's tenant, Humphrey Barnes had 3 stepchildren with the surname Woodward, so more family ties.

The tithe map list of owners and tenants of each plot of land has made it possible to identify the people living around William Oliver and Silas Bunting. The census records tell us the names of all those living in the Dale but the lack of house numbers makes it impossible to tie a particular family to a particular house.

If your family records hold any more information, I'd love to hear from you to add more details to Bonsall's fascinating History.

PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Council Report for meeting on 19th March 2024

Public Speaking: Cllr Buckler mentioned that applications can be made to the Local Project Fund from 1April and advised any application should be made early and must make a compelling case for funds. This will be added to the agenda at the next meeting.

Following discussions about the land at 48 High Street and the possibility of it being used for social housing, he talked about Community Land Trusts whereby a local community can take over land for the benefit of the community. The Chair thanks him for his comments.

Quarrying update: Cllr Grover reported that following the last blast from Ball Eye quarry some residents had complained of the noise and disturbance, but many others had no issues to report. He reported that David Collins from Ball Eye quarry is putting messages on the Village Matters Facebook page regularly and Cllr Grover will ask him to liaise with concerned residents who do not use Facebook. He mentioned that Ball Eye quarry seems to be doing what it can to maintain a good relationship with residents. He went on to report that there is a new ecology submission concerning Slinter and this had gone to DDDC for consideration.

Website: The Clerk reported that Parish Online has not copied across all the material from the old website and they say they cannot do a bulk upload so only the previous 2 years' Minutes are on the new website. Clerk was asked to copy all previous years. There was some discussion about the format of the new website. Clerk was asked to request help from Brett to keep all material from the old website. It was agreed Clerk can pay the bill. It was suggested there should be a page for relevant documents, e.g. Minutes of Quarry Group meetings, MP's letter, etc.

Contractors: Clerk reported that she has asked the insurance company about costs for adding contractors for BPC policy, but has not heard back as yet. Clerk to investigate further and discuss with B Alsop the possible need for her to have Public Liability insurance. BPC will also recruit a second Lengthsman to assist Peter Spencer. Clerk to put a notice in the Mutterings inviting interested people to apply for details and Job Description by 15th April (ready for discussion at the next BPC meeting). Cllr J Smith to put this on Village Matters. (Please see separate notice.)

Lime trees in Churchyard: There was a discussion about the planned work. Clerk to chase up the tree surgeon who is to do the work of cutting back epicormic growth and removing dead branches. Clerk to gather quotes for a survey of the whole

churchyard. Cllr Barry to forward details to Clerk of the tree surgeon he spoke to.

The Cross: Cllr Grover and the Clerk met with a stonemason to discuss repairs to the Cross. Cllr Grover has contacted various heritage bodies such as Derbyshire Historic Buildings trust and will continue to discuss the matter with them. Architectural survey to be conducted. Work is unlikely to begin before summer 2025 which leaves time for the necessary fundraising.

Meeting with Sarah Dines MP: Chair reported that he and Cllr Grover met with Sarah Dines together with County Councillor Dermot Murphy. She spent time walking through the village and saw first-hand the state of the roads, chatting with residents about various issues along the way.

Light at the Cross: The Clerk reported that National Grid had sent an estimate of £700 to disconnect the light. Clerk to check they have the correct light in mind. It was agreed that if this is indeed the cost, it would not be viable to replace the light with a solar powered one.

Defibrillators: Clerk reported that the overall cost to BPC so far for all the defibrillators is £300. R Taylor has confirmed that no further supplies are due until 2025 and that he and others will continue fundraising for on-going costs. The question of insurance was discussed and whether BPC should be responsible for this. Clerk to ask insurers what extra cost would be.




