

Local businesses and vendors provided a delightful selection of street food and drink for the event seeing a good flow of custom throughout the weekend. The trail also sponsored Wild Roots Creative which is a social enterprise offering engaging opportunities to experience arts, crafts, and culture in a natural space. A local Bonsall resident also provided dry clay workshops over the weekend which proved popular. Adults and children enjoyed the experiences. The trail once again supported 'Dementia Groups', sponsoring local group 'Wabi Sabi' from the stone centre in Wirksworth. They sold pottery made by people with dementia and their carers, with all proceeds going back into the group.

The trail was not without problems, following the burst water pipes in Upper Town which affected water to residents and prevented the minibuses passing, also reducing the number of visitors that reached there. Nevertheless, artists and hosts kept buoyant throughout with a bit of wartime spirit!

Artist Lucy Burns (LJaybeeillustrations) was sponsored by the trail and worked on a mural titled 'Wilder Bonsall' to be displayed in public areas. It will reside in St. James Church first.

Bonsall Arts Trail Group is a non-profit organisation and all money received goes into the running of the event. All the organisers and committee are volunteers and give up their time freely. The event takes a full year to organise and if anyone steps forward to take on a 2026 event, organisation will start again in 9 months' time.

This year we have sponsored the school, and provided materials and artists, for painting a new mural in school. Children have collaborated and the mural has been made up of the children's drawings.

Bonsall Arts Trail has repaired the utility hole covers on the park and will be upgrading the electrics box on the children's park hopefully in time for the carnival. Three Pop up marquees have been bought by the Trail - two 6 metre x 3 metre and one 3 metre x 3 metre. The marquees will be made available for use by the Carnival and for other village fundraising events.

We hope everyone in the village enjoyed the event as much as we did. The aim is to make the trail a cultural event, enhancing the village's identity and attracting tourists. This should in turn support artists in a celebration to foster a sense of belonging and camaraderie.



# American skunk cabbage

Derbyshire Wildlife Trust has been made aware of an invasive species growing on the riverbank downstream of Bonsall. A few American skunk cabbage (Lysichiton americanus) plants have been spotted along the brook in Via Gellia Woodlands Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). It is possible that they have grown there as a result of seeds travelling downstream, possibly from a garden in the village. This is a non-native invasive plant with the potential to become a real problem as seeds spread and the plant out-competes native plants.

Yellow flowers are produced in spring, resembling those of wild arum (lordsand-ladies) but much larger. They emit a strong odour like that of skunk. The plant has a basal rosette of leathery leaves, up to about 1 m long, which increase markedly in size as the season progresses. Its normal habitat is wet woodland, where it grows on bare or partly-vegetated nutrient-rich mud.

American skunk cabbage was first recorded in the wild in 1947 in Surrey and was originally introduced to the UK from Western North America as an ornamental plant in 1901. Since then it has spread across Britain, particularly in southern and western areas. Once established the plant can spread quickly. Infestations can dominate large areas and crowd out native species in important habitats such as wet woodlands. In 2016, American skunk cabbage was banned from sale in the UK. Now gardeners are being urged to make sure that they Be Plant Wise, dispose of plants correctly and ensure they do not discard this species in the natural environment.

If you have this species in your garden, we would be very grateful if you could remove it, as the plant has the potential to spread in a way similar to Himalayan balsam, where it seeds and takes over riverbanks until there is very little native vegetation remaining. It is recommended that plants are dug out and burned, taking care to remove every part of the rhizomes. If possible, this should be done before the seed heads develop. You should look out for this plant every year as seeds can remain viable for about 10 years.

# Parish Council Report for meeting on

Parish Council Report for meeting on 16 July 2024

Repair of Cross: After much discussion, it was agreed that Clerk will approach Wirksworth Heritage Centre and DDDC, while Cllr Grover approaches SPAB, to source approved structural surveyor so the extent of the work can be assessed and grants sought. It was agreed that further patching of the problem by just repairing the mortar will not be sufficient. This is a big piece of work involving an iconic village monument and English Heritage will have to be informed. It was also noted that HGVs using the village as a cut through is increasing the damage. It was decided to set up a committee devoted to the issue. All the Cllrs wished to join and the first meeting will be scheduled for August. Cllr J Smith to arrange date.

Light at the Cross: The Clerk reported that National Grid had explained that the amount of energy Npower is told to charge is based on a 70w bulb. Cllr Barry to discuss with electrician with a view to fitting a bulb using less electricity. Clerk also asked to approach Wirksworth Heritage Centre to enquire about finance of a similar lamp in Wirksworth.

**Flooding:** The Clerk reported that there is still no response from DCC to letter sent in December. Clerk to forward to Dermot Murphy to press for response.

**Quarrying update:** No further update. Cllr Grover reported that tree work had been started.

Churchyard trees: Clerk reported that the pruning to the lime trees has been a great success. Following advice from the tree surgeon and DDDC Tree Officer, the old yew will be pruned in order to prevent a collapse of the big side branch. Permission has been given and work will be carried out ASAP. A survey of churchyard trees has been done and there is no immediate work needed. It was agreed to seek quote to remove the small lime tree near the school which is one of three small trees planted some time ago. This tree is harming the big lime and the yew behind it.

**Public WCs:** 1) it was agreed to proceed with a 7-year lease. Clerk to contact DDDC to request if budget will be available for on-going costs. 2) It was noted there has been further vandalism. The Council noted its thanks to Becky Allsopp for all the cleaning work she does and regretted this on-going issue

with vandalism which makes her job harder.

**Village sign:** Clerk reported response from another local clerk concerning their sign which includes a picture. She was asked to enquire further in case they can provide any more information.

**Park:** 1) Cllr Grover reported the electricity box in the play area is now safely kept shut. 2) &;3) A walk around park prior to carnival was organised and will include inspection of dead trees.

**Planter by war memorial:** Cllr Barry to source 2 barrels to replace planter which is dilapidated.

**Staff Induction and Risk Assessments:** Clerk explained staff had received instructions regarding safety equipment. Clerk was advised to document it. Clerk reported Risk Assessments will be done during August.

Matters brought forward from last month

Cllrs have provided photos to be uploaded to new website. Clerk to proceed with monitoring of traffic to site with the help of website provider.

The next Parish Council Meeting will take place on Tuesday 17 September at 7.30pm in the Village Hall.



# FRUIT CAKE RECIPE

Ingredients: 1 - Egg

340g - Mixed Fruit 115g - Sugar

115g - Butter or Margarine 230g - Self Raising Flour

115ml - Water

Method:

Place Fruit, Sugar, Butter or Margarine and Water in a pan and simmer slowly for 20 minutes.

Allow to cool slightly & fold in the flour.

Turn into a greased 18cm (7") tin.

Bake in moderate oven Gas mark 4, 180°C (160°C fan) for approx 50 mins.

# VICTORIA SPONGE RECIPE

Ingredients: 3 - Medium Eggs

170g - Butter or Margarine170g - Caster Sugar170g - Self Raising Flour

For the filling: Fill with Raspberry jam

when cold.

Light dusting with caster sugar to decorate.

#### Method:

Set oven to Gas mark 4 180°C (160°C fan)

Grease and base line the bottom of two 18/20cm (7"/8") sandwich tins.

Cream Butter or Margarine and Sugar

Beat the eggs then gradually add to the mixture beating well each time.

Sieve the flour and fold into the mixture with a metal spoon

Divide equally between the two tins and bake for 25 minutes in the middle of the oven.

They are ready when golden, shrunk back from the sides of the tin and spring back when touched.

Remove from the tins when cold and fill with raspberry jam.

A light dusting of caster sugar on the top to finish (and to cover up mistakes!!)
