### Murder in Bonsall (part one)

At about midnight on 4th July, 1880, the soaking, bedraggled figure of Mary Wright appeared at Elizabeth Spencer's door and told her, "Addie's on the moor." Mary was the twenty-six-year-old daughter of James (grocer and farmer) and Alice Wright from Bonsall Bank, and had a three-year-old illegitimate daughter called Adeline. For weeks, Mary had not been her usual lively self, and her mother was so worried about her general behaviour and her sleep-walking, that she insisted Mary shared her bed with her sisters. The cause of this depression became apparent when Mary confessed to her father, on that July morning, that she was pregnant again. James explained: "I said I really will not allow such kind of work in my house. I said she was disgracing me. She said she would go, but she did not say where to."

This 'do-not-darken-my-doorstep-again' reaction of a typical Victorian father must have tipped Mary's fragile, unhappy state of mind over the edge. Taking Addie with her, she wandered distractedly around the moor roads for a long time before going into one of her father's fields that had a mere in it. Here, she clasped her daughter tightly to her chest and lay down in the water, which was only about two feet deep at the time. Adeline drowned, but Mary, despite her desperate attempts, failed to kill herself. "I did not throw it in; I took it into my arms and meant to die with it. But I could not do it, though I have been in the water more than two hours."

How she felt on her bleak traipse back home defies imagination. Too scared to approach her father, she went to her neighbour's house. Elizabeth Spencer fetched her husband, Henry, and James Wright, and the two men went up to the mere to look for the child. Henry felt her body at the bottom of the water, and they lifted her out, wrapped her in a shawl, and brought her home. The village policeman, P.C. Hall, was called. He arrested Mary, and she was taken to Wirksworth lock-up, pending her trial at Derby assizes.
