The is taken following newsletter monthly the Wirksworth Team Ministry: "Earlier this year we held a series of weekly meetings in Wirksworth, where a group of us discussed a range of issues connected with Christian beliefs and the Church. Normally, folk say never discuss religion or politics as it always ends in an argument. Well in this case, it didn't. Some of the attendees were from Bonsall. They found it to be an interesting and informative series of meetings. Because of the positive response we received, it has been decided to hold the future meetings at St. James Church in Bonsall. The meetings will be held at 7.30pm on the first Tuesday of every month and will last for about ninety minutes each. Everyone is invited, not just the regular church attendees. You don't even need to be a Christian. If you turn up then we would be very pleased to see you and you can be sure of a warm welcome. It is up to you whether you put forward questions for group discussion or just sit and listen to what's said by others.

It's your church at the end of the day. Its purpose isn't just about an hourly Sunday service for a few. It's about using the building as a community meeting place where anyone can meet to share their experiences and thoughts and exchange ideas about a range of subjects connected to life in general and what part, if any, the church and matters of faith and religion can play in our lives." Growing up in the late 40s and with a sister and brother born in the early 50s, our childhood days were very different from today - transport was the bus or walk, no TV, radio only, we listened to "Listen with Mother" and I was an Archers addict! After attending Chapel on a Sunday afternoon we enjoyed tea along with the Preacher and family (at least 12 of us) at Grandma Land's house on the Bankside. This was a small two up, two down cottage with an outside toilet (an earth closet) at the top of the garden

The Chapel evening service began at 6.15 pm to time with the arrival of the bus which came right to the top of the Dale. Mum, myself and my sister and brother went home on the bus, except in the school holidays when we stayed for evening service and walked home!

When we arrived home in Cromford, we got ready for bed and then Mum would read us a story before tucking us up in bed. After the evening service, when

Dad came home, he always came upstairs to say goodnight and switch off the light. So our love of books began as children and continues, as I still like to read in bed! I also have two books purchased from charity shops ready for Christmas reading, God willing.

However, I do enjoy reading the Bible and have Bible Commentary books to help me appreciate and learn more about the Bible and people whose lives are recorded in the Bible. They are just like people today, although they lived a slower pace of life with no books, modern conveniences or technology! I have been reading about Adam and Eve and temptation - "did God really say?" the serpent questioned them! And when Jesus was tempted by Satan about God's Word, He responded to Satan by referring to what the Bible says (Matthew 4 v 1 - 11). Luke in his Gospel writes "I myself have carefully investigated everything from the beginning and it seemed good to write an orderly account for you, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught. Luke 1 v 1 - 4. Why not read Matthew and Luke's Gospels Chapters 1 and 2 and see for yourself how Jesus came to be born in Bethlehem and the visits of the Shepherds and Magi (Wise Men)? How Jesus really is the Saviour of the World! 

Bonsall Village Hall News

Autumn Fair: The Village Hall committee held the Autumn Fair on the 9 November, which is a fundraiser for the Village Hall and we are thrilled that £836.90 was made for the Hall. Thank you to the people who came and supported the event, the people and businesses who donated raffle prizes. The people and committee's other halves, who baked cakes, donated their time, manned stalls and helped in the kitchen. Good to see Judy Land, Trustee, back behind the counter and a big thank you to Leigh Johnson, Trustee, for his whiskey draw, which contributed £186 to the fundraising.

Open Gardens Donation: A huge thank you to the Open Gardens for their generous donation of £250 for the Village Hall. As with all donations, it is very much appreciated. It was a wonderful weekend to have over £1000 going into the Village Hall coffers, rather than going out. While we look for grants to support projects, the day to day running costs and annual checks have to be covered by income received either from users of the hall, fundraising events or donations.

Grant from Better Derbyshire Dales Fund: The Committee are thrilled to have received a grant of £2,500 from Better Derbyshire Dales fund to go towards purchasing a new cooker and tea urn for the kitchen. The current cooker has its limitations and is around 20 years old. We acquired it free from a generous villager and it has served us well. The luncheon club have kindly donated £100 towards the costs, but we still need to find some extra money to provide a robust and efficient cooker and tea urn for years to come. Any donations would be greatly received.

Village Hall hire rates: Reviewing the yearly running costs, the committee have agreed to increase the hire cost for a village organisation to £15 a session, a session being a morning, afternoon or evening, for the use of one floor. To hire both floors will be £20 per session. We have made no changes to the other hire rates. The new rates will commence from 1 January 2025, but we will honour any pre-paid bookings made for the year 2025. It was a decision not made lightly, but with increased running costs, we have a responsibility to ensure the money coming in, is covering the everyday expenditure. Looking at other

local Village Halls, we remain very competitive, and offer a lot for the hire charge.

St James Church - New **Kitchen and Toilet**

As many people will know, there has been a concerted effort over the last few years to raise a considerable amount of money to fund the installation of an accessible toilet and kitchen facility in the church. St James has had no running water for the past 800 years and certainly nothing by way of a useable toilet in the church.

It's with great joy and celebration that we can announce that at the time of writing, the project is nearly complete!

This has been achieved through a dedicated band of volunteers keeping 'JIMMY's Cafe' open three days per week over the last few years. Here you can buy home-made soup, cobs and fantastic cakes at a very reasonable cost. As a result of all the efforts so far, we have raised over £65,000 for the fund. A massive thank you to everyone who has baked, cooked, served and supported this over the years - and long may this continue to provide this valued service to our village and those who visit. In addition to money raised through the cafe, other events have bolstered the coffers. Namely, Rock Choir Concert, Bell Ringers BBQs at the carnival over the years, PIMS at Open Gardens, Craft Sales and Christmas stalls, and the sale of unwanted pews.

The remainder of the money has then come from generous donations and grants. We are forever in gratitude from the following grant funders: Derbyshire Dales District Council, Derbyshire Diocesan Board of Finance, Raymond Ross, Ernest Bailey, Garfield Weston Foundation, the National Churches Trust, Bernard Sunley Foundation and the Duke of Devonshire Foundation. We also want to thank the organisation who have generously donated towards the project:

Wildgoose, Slinter Mining, Collins Earthworks, Bennett Quarry and the Longcliffe Quarry.

By way to celebrate and see the finished product, please come and see for yourself on Saturday 14 December between 1pm and 4pm, when the church will be being decorated for Christmas and offering you Mulled Wine and Mince Pies by way of a thank you for all your support! (Please be aware at the time of going to press we are trusting that everything will be installed by then for you to see, but if it isn't you'll still be able to partake of the goodies and see the nearly completed kitchen even if it isn't quite finished!!)



THE VILLAGE GREEN

Bonsall Energy Group - Community Engagement

It was great to share the findings so far from our community energy feasibility study at the village hall in October. We had such an engaged group of people in the room and the questions, comments and discussions really helped us to consider Bonsall's community energy potential from new angles. Overall, the event confirmed to us that people are supportive of the types of initiative we are developing as long as we continue to make sure that the village benefit is maximised and the impact on our local environment is minimised. However, we know that those present at the event represented only a fraction of the people who live in the village, so if anyone else would like to feed back any comments or questions to BEG we would be pleased to receive them. You can view the presentation slides from the community event and give us your views and comments on the BEG website at www.bonsallenergy.group. The feasibility study is due to be completed by February 2025. Another community presentation will be arranged at the village hall in March. It is hoped that the projects that appear to be the most favourable from the study will then be taken forward to the next stage during 2025, subject of course to us securing additional community energy funding. Projects that are currently looking favourable include roof solar schemes on community buildings such as the village hall and possibly the school and church along with wind turbine projects above Ball Eye Quarry and possibly at Moor Farm Quarry on Blakelow Lane. We are hopeful that the first (solar roof) project(s) might be installed during 2025 with other projects to follow on over the coming years.

Our next BEG meeting is on Tuesday 10 December in the village hall, 7.30pm. All

Wilder Bonsall Update

The Wilder Bonsall group is passionate about keeping our village beautiful and well-maintained. While our name might suggest a preference for untamed wilderness, the truth is quite the opposite. Our aims are to control vegetation while fostering a thriving ecosystem, balancing the desire for beauty and nature with the need for accessible and safe pathways within the village. Many villagers fondly remember a time when Bonsall's pathways and walls were free from overgrown brambles and nettles. This is the vision that drives Wilder Bonsall. Our group believes that responsible vegetation management is crucial to achieving this goal.

Much of our work looks and feels exactly like gardening. We may choose to leave seed heads for a longer period than a traditional gardener in order to allow natural re-seeding, but our ultimate goal aligns with that of many of our villagers, which is a thriving and visually appealing Bonsall. Wilder Bonsall is not intended to replace the Parish Council's responsibility, instead the group aims to work alongside the council and the community to create a village that honours its past while embracing a future filled with natural beauty. Our vision is to create a wellkept and picturesque environment that also supports biodiversity, reminiscent of the time when the village was vibrant with life and the village looked and felt cared for.

The group has had a busy year, and here are some of our achievements:

- Planted over 150 bulbs and wildflower seeds at Nether Green, Wragg Croft and the Well at the top of High Street.
- Organised the big Village Clean Up to prepare the village for Open Gardens with over 20 villagers cutting back brambles and nettles on the Clatterway and The Dale.
- Participated in the Open Gardens (many thanks for the kind donation) with the Community Garden, Nether Green, Wragg Croft and the High St well.
- Regularly maintained the Community Garden.
- Planted fox gloves, campion and borage at Wragg Croft and the Community Garden.

We are in the process of planning an exciting programme of activities for 2025 - applying to the Community Nature Fund, running village awareness, raising events, including building bug hotels in the Community Garden and working with Bonsall School to develop a wildflower garden.

With more members of the group, we will be able to do even more to achieve our aim of controlling vegetation while encouraging biodiversity and natural beauty. So, keep your eyes on the diary page for dates of our work parties and events, and come along and join in the fun!

PARISH COUNCIL

Parish Council Report for meeting on 19 November 2024

WEBSITE: The old website is no longer operational. All residents are urged to visit the new website (www.bonsall-pc.gov.uk).

PUBLIC SPEAKING: None

PARK: a) Lease: Clerk reported that she is waiting to hear from the Diocese to renew the park lease which currently expires in March. She reported that DDDC suggested they would be handing back the play area at that time. Clerk to clarify with DDDC that this should be renewed. Question of wheelchair access from Yeoman Street to be revisited after renewal of lease; b) It was noted that there are 2 large véhicles permanently parked. Clerk to issue the standard notice informing owner of the van that vehicles without MOT cannot be parked there. Clerk to compose letter to be sent to the owner of the lorry informing them of the Council policy that vehicles should not be parked there permanently. Councillors were also concerned that there is a pile of bricks which has been left there which may cause injury to children playing and is also unsightly.

DRAINS AND ROAD CONDITION UPPERTOWN:

It was agreed that Uppertown Lane is in a shocking state. Encroachment of the verges has made the road increasingly narrow. It was agreed that the response of DCC and DDDC has been very disappointing. Clerk to report potholes and obstruction via DCC website and also to contact Green & Clean team at DDDC.

VIA GELLIA

Cllr Grover reported the dangerous state of the pavement which has still not been addressed. Mud and leaves, also potholes and lorries mounting the pavement, make it perilous for pedestrians. Cllr Grover to provide photos to Clerk. Clerk to report to DCC and Green & Clean team at DDDC.

REPAIR OF CROSS

The survey has been done and report is awaited. Čllr Grover confirmed receipt of grant from Open Gardens to cover the cost.

QUARRYING

No update. Cllr S Smith queried whether the large platform being built at Ball Eye was connected to the proposed wind turbine, but this was confirmed not to be the case.

HOUSING NEEDS ASSESSMENT: Council voted 5:1 not to participate in this scheme.

WEBSITE: Cllr S Smith produced a report on the state of the new website. Clerk to work with Parish On-line to make alterations. Clerk reported there have been 25 users of the new website in the last 30 days.

WAR MEMORIAL: Cllr Barry reported that the railings round the War Memorial need re-painting and the light needs cleaning. Cllr Barry to arrange with P Spencer and G Hardy.

VILLAGE SIGNS: Cllr Barry reported the village welcome sign is still on the back burner. He reported that there has been extensive damage to the wall on Moor Lane owned by Hollies farm as it appears 4x4 vehicles have driven along it. Clerk to ask Highways Dept to erect a further sign at the start of the lane warning about width restrictions.

POPPIES: Cllr Barry reported he put the poppies in place for remembrance and would like to hear from villagers for their opinion of the placing of poppies.


