

Toads and Roads

Spring is springing and the frogs are celebrating in the ponds around Bonsall. It will soon be time for the toads to start looking for a mate too. There are volunteers who venture out each Spring to help toads avoid massacre on the roads around many villages in the UK as all wild life is sadly declining.

Some villages close roads for several weeks! This doesn't happen round Bonsall but the toads still cross – they know how to cross as they've been doing it to the same pond or mere for hundreds of years, but they haven't yet learned how to avoid the traffic!!
The males sit in the middle of the road where they can clearly see an attractive female waiting to cross, and then they join her, sometimes hitching a ride to defend her from other suiters.

Obviously squatting in the road is not a very bright thing to do these days, so volunteers collect them in buckets and carry them across to safety. The males are delightful little things, the females larger, swollen with spawn at this time of year. These volunteers will be out in the next few weeks, in the dark, with torches and Hi Vis, in an attempt to save as many toads as possible, not just for the toads, but for future generations. Peak District National Park Authority approved restructure under financial pressures

The Peak District National Park Authority has today (25th February 2025) approved restructuring proposals that have been driven by a need to reduce

The Authority is facing ongoing financial pressures due to a fixed government grant that does not take into account inflation and additional pressures such as the recent increase in Employers National Insurance Contributions, the rise in the minimum wage, the ending of the government's rate relief scheme, and some external costs rising by as much as

Overall the Authority has faced a real-terms cut of around 50% over the last ten years. The continual squeeze on funding has happened at the same time as those using the National Park have increased and expectations about what the National Park should be delivering for nature, climate and wellbeing are rising.

It is only two years since the Authority last had to undertake a restructure programme. Those changes reduced senior management roles by more than half and combined several service areas whilst allowing for an investment in the Authority's statutory planning function. However, since the last round of changes the Authority has faced unprecedented financial pressures whilst the core government grant remains flat.

The changes approved include making efficiencies within important functions such as customer services and communications. There will be a reduction in the size and scope of much cherished work in the areas of community engagement, education and wellbeing, although alternative funding opportunities for priority projects are being pursued.

With the ongoing support of a philanthropic donor, some transformational changes are also being proposed for the Authority's Visitor and Cycle Hire Centres to ensure their longterm viability.

Phil Mulligan, the Authority's Chief Executive said, "We are facing a very challenging financial landscape. The approved structure changes are extremely difficult and upsetting for everyone. We are cutting or reducing some of our high profile and much valued programmes. None of us wanted to make these decisions but they cannot be avoided unless there is significantly better news from government on our funding.



Parish Council Report for meeting on 18 March 2025

News from County Council

Cllr Murphy reported on the Via Gellia project: only 50% of the trees needing removal have been taken down; the remainder will be taken down in the autumn. He also noted that the contractor has been replaced. Average speed cameras are due to be in place April-May

Cllr Murphy was concerned about the condition of the roads and will visit Uppertown Lane and Yeoman Street to see the potholes and road condition with a view to helping resolve the problem.

Park

Cllr J Smith confirmed the play area has now been handed over to BPC. There are on-going costs to consider; for example, new bark for the climbing frame area will cost £2k, and work is needed to repair the junior slide. It is imperative to ensure the village is involved, as maintaining the play area will be a community effort and there will be an on-going need for fundraising. Bonsall Players have kindly offered to help with costs and to volunteer with work. It is hoped that other village organisations will also get involved. There will be a monthly update in Mutterings under the Village Noticeboard section. It was agreed to establish a Park Committee to cover the park, churchyard, car park and public WC's. The lengthsmen will fill in the potholes in the car park.

Wilder Bonsall

There was some debate about the insurance for Wilder Bonsall which is now in the process of being resolved. Wilder Bonsall has requested that the park bank should be strimmed in September to encourage wildflowers; it was decided this would be discussed by the new Park Committee which would then report back to BPC where a decision would be made.

Website

The Clerk is to continue working on the website to implement changes BPC wishes to make. If anyone has feedback, please share with the Clerk for reporting back to the PC.

Policies and Grit Bins

The new policies covering grit bins and recording of meetings were adopted, along with the new Standing Orders policy. The Clerk will work on new Code of Conduct and Financial Regulations policies.

Finance Committee

It was agreed to establish a Finance Committee in line with the practice of other Parish Councils. This will meet in the next couple of weeks.

Potholes and verges

It was noted that although DDDC has swept one side of Clatterway the gullies on the other side are still full of leaves. Clerk to contact Green & Clean to request that more sweeping is done and to request a meeting with the team to discuss on-going issues.

VE Day

It was agreed to mark this occasion and at the next meeting the PC will discuss the purchase of flags, bunting etc. It was also agreed to put poppies back around the village for the occasion.


