## **CHURCH NEWS**

#### The Fourth Man in the Fire

Growing up as a child in the 80s I had the joy of attending a Sunday School in our local church. Unbeknownst to me this was the far distant beginnings of my journey of faith with God. What I soon realised in those days, is that the bible has some great stories in it. Stories of love, violence, heroes and the age-old battle of good

And I soon learned 2 simple truths during

that time. 1) God was amazingly powerful. 2) Jesus loved me with an amazing love. Wow, how I wish I could have the simple faith of my 8-year-old self. It takes the stupidity of an adult to make God complex and to question his power and love for us. One of the classic stories taught in Sunday Schools, that reminds us of both God's power and love, is in the Old Testament. It is a story of 3 men Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego. These men were living in a country where the king had created a golden statue and proclaimed an order that all people of the nation must bow down before it or be thrown in to furnace.

These men refused to bow down to the statue, as they had a greater allegiance to God Almighty, and they would not worship an idol made by the hands of men. The king enraged, seizes them and throws them in the furnace shouting '...what God will be able to rescue you?'

And as the fire rages, the king looks in to the pit and sees 4 men. Bewildered, he asks 'didn't we chuck 3 men in? I can count 4 and one of them looks like the son of the

God was with Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, he was the fourth man in the fire. He was with them in their greatest moment of trial, their greatest fear. God was with them, he walked with them, as the great psalm tell us, through the valley of the shadow of death.

Ah but this is just a nice story for children! We shouldn't give too much weight to it! But hang on... let me tell you, as I look back on my life, one thing I can say about God, is that he is always the fourth man in the fire.

I, like you, have faced situations that are just beyond me. I have faced fear, heartbreak and pain. I have faced, a child with Leukaemia, I have faced falling off waterfalls and being stuck in caves. I have faced severe mental illness, I have felt the loss of loved ones, I have felt lonely and unloved. I have felt lost and hopeless.

Time and again, I have faced the furnace, and called on my God to rescue me, and time and again, he is my fourth man in the

#### Victory in Europe day at **Bonsall CE School**

Two super boys from Year 6, Freddie and Alfie, discuss what they did on 'Victory in Europe Day'.

In school the children marked VE day with a Red, White and Blue themed own clothes day and a special Collective Worship. During the morning, Year 6 walked down to Bonsall Cross to remember and celebrate the people from Bonsall who fought in the Second World War.

At 11am they read a poem. Mr Johnson then read out all the names on the memorial. Mrs Marshall. School Governor. was there and it was a particularly special day for her as it was her birthday! After reading the poem, the children sang 'Happy Birthday'.

Alfie saw the name 'Gratton' on the memorial and so is sure they must be his relatives as his Mum was a Gratton from Bonsall.

The children are learning about World War 2 in their History lessons at school. Freddie had brought in a shell case to school that his great great grandfather had brought back from the war. Fred Wildgoose was a Marine who had fought throughout WW2.

The boys had learned a lot about the war: about Dunkirk, about the Blitz (they had read a book called 'When The Sky Falls In' by Phil Earle) and about how German cities were flattened by the Allies.

They talked about the Home Guard who helped to put out fires, worked with the Rescue Services and reminded people to be careful about gossiping.

#### Bonsall Energy Group (BEG) - Community Engagement **Event on 14 June**

There will be a presentation of the findings from the Community Energy feasibility study to residents of Bonsall and Slaley at Bonsall Village Hall on Saturday 14 June commencing at 2.30pm.

The study has been undertaken on behalf of BEG by John Beardmore from T4 Sustainability, based in Ilkeston. We would love to hear your views and comments on the range of feasible projects for our community that have come out of the study. As was mentioned in the May edition of Mutterings, we would like to develop roof top solar PV on community buildings including the village hall and possibly the school and St James' church as well as at a number of farms within the

village. We are hopeful that these could be included as community power generators in a local energy trading club we are looking into setting up later this year. Anyone in the community would be able to join this club for an annual subscription and benefit from cheaper electricity during the times when local renewable energy is being generated and exported. Wind turbine and ground solar PV schemes have also been considered and these would be significant generators for a local energy trading club though these would of course be subject to obtaining the necessary planning approvals and securing development funding through grants, loans, share offers

Come along and find out more of what may be possible and have your say in our plans for taking forward some of these exciting renewable energy projects which would benefit our community and its residents as well as reduce our carbon footprint. #### 4 week Boat Share for Sale Narrowboat Burland

The Bonsall Boat Club was formed in 2003, following an inaugural meeting in the Village Hall. Some of those attending were experienced boaters, others were novices, and some had never been on a narrowboat but liked the idea. We decided to buy a boat with enough berths to accommodate larger families and guests and, within a few weeks, we found Burland for sale in Stoke-on-Trent. It is a 50foot narrowboat that was professionally fitted out in 1996 with six berths (three double beds), so meeting the group's requirements.

The group currently consists of eleven families, some of whom live in Bonsall with the others in nearby villages or friends of Bonsall families.

There are three levels of shareholding: 2-week, 3-week or 4-week shares and there is now a 4 WEEK SHAREHOLDING FOR SALE. The capital outlay for a new family wishing to buy shares is based on a boat valuation. This cost is refunded if the shares are sold, based on an up-to-date valuation. The non-refundable running costs include the annual Canal and River Trust licence, insurance, servicing and any repairs. These are divided pro-rata according to each family's shareholding, and have averaged about £500 per year for a 2-week share, which compares very favourably with the cost of hiring. The other costs for individual families are a

toilet pumpout and the red diesel used during their time on the boat, but the cost of gas is shared by the group.

The boat is fully equipped with a gas hob and oven and all the utensils and crockery needed to cook meals on board, as well as a fridge with a small freezer compartment, a shower and toilet, and a diesel stove for heating in the spring and autumn. All you need to take with you is bedding and towels.



## PARISH COUNCIL

#### Report for 13 May Meeting

New Councillors Needed: Following the resignations of two Parish Councillors, there are still 3 spaces on the Parish Council. Please consider if you would like to join and contact the Clerk for further information.

#### **Annual Meeting**

The Annual Meeting took place prior to the monthly meeting. It was decided that in the coming year priority will be given to The Cross. Generally, it was agreed that projects and activities take too long to complete and the PC needs to look at ways at making its efforts more efficient. It is also important to attract new members of the Council.

#### **News from District Council**

Cllr Buckler noted he had already been in touch with the new County Councillor (Cllr Hunter) to discuss the state of the roads. He confirmed that the banking hub in Bakewell is operational and will be moved to a permanent site soon. The work in Hall Leys Park, including the skateboard park, has been completed using the Local Projects Fund.

There is now 30 mins free parking in DDDC car parks. To claim your 30 minutes free parking, you are required get a paper ticket from the machine. This is so parking enforcement officers are made aware of when you arrived, helps to avoid confusion and avoidable parking fines. This offer cannot be used to top up a chargeable parking ticket, as it has been specifically created for short stay customers who will be staying no longer than 30 minutes. This offer cannot be used to top up the resident's free concession permit to allow you to park at 2.30pm or arrive at 10.30am.

#### <u>Park</u>

There have been improvements and repairs in the playground including concreting the top of the slide and fitting new swing seats with money donated by Ball Eye Quarry. The PC will have a table at Carnival to publicise the situation about the playground. On the downside it was reported that some young people have been setting fire to exploding canisters in the car park – this is a serious fire risk.

#### Website

Work continues to improve the streamline and improve the site. If anyone has feedback, please share with the Clerk for reporting back to the PC.

#### The Cross

It was agreed to set up a working group to oversee the issue of repairs. Cllr Grover will contact the surveyor again to discuss next steps with a view to applying for necessary grants. It was decided this must be a priority for the PC going forward and ensuring the repair of this important monument will become a major project which the PC hopes will involve the whole village.

The PC adopted a new IT policy and Reserves policy. Clerk to format as necessary and upload to website. The Personnel policy is still to be completed.

#### Public WC's

The lease has now been signed by the owner and the PC (the legal bill to be paid by DDDC).

#### Village Shop

The Parish Council would like to thank Anne Dodds for opening and running a village shop for the past 10 years. It is with regret that that shop has had to close but totally understandable. This village asset was a life-saver during Covid, and every harsh winter. (Please note that some groceries can still be bought via the café.)




